The County Board of Commissioners met in the Commissioners' Room at 9:00 AM. Present were Commissioners Kip Bruender, Patty O'Connor, Mark Piepho, Kevin Paap, and Vance Stuehrenberg. Also present were County Administrator Robert Meyer, County Attorney Pat McDermott, and Administrative Assistant Stephanie Jahnke.

**RESOLUTION GRANTING APPROVAL OF AN INTERIM USE PERMIT TO OPERATE A SHORT-TERM RENTAL UNIT IN THE SHORELAND OF LAKE WASHINGTON. THE PROPERTY IS ZONED RURAL RESIDENCE AND LOCATED WITHIN THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 20, JAMESTOWN TOWNSHIP – TOWNSHIP 109 N, RANGE 25 W.**

**WHEREAS**, Gross Revocable Family Trust, owner of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, to wit:

Lot 6 Block 1 of Gurni Subdivision part of Northwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 20, Jamestown Township - 109 N, Range 25 W, Blue Earth County, Minnesota, as shown on Attachment A – Location Map; and

**WHEREAS**, Gross Revocable Family Trust has made application for an interim use permit to operate a Short-Term Rental Unit; and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 05-23), a copy of said report has been presented to the Planning Commission; and,

**WHEREAS**, the request is consistent with the Blue Earth County Land Use Plan and Rural Residence District and Shoreland Interim Uses, as authorized by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners; and,

**WHEREAS**; the Planning Commission of the County on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of February 2023, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the request, voted unanimously to continue the public hearing to the 1<sup>st</sup> day of March 2023.

**WHEREAS**, following due consideration of presented testimony and information, on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of March 2023, the Planning Commission voted four in favor, and one opposed to forward the matter to the County Board with a recommendation for approval subject to conditions contained in staff report PC 05-23 and,

**WHEREAS**; the County Board on the 21<sup>st</sup> Day of March 2023, held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to approve the request subject to conditions contained in staff report PC 05-23 and,

**WHEREAS**, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

- a. That the proposed use conforms with the County Land Use Plan which encourages preserving neighborhoods by encouraging similar uses.
- b. That there is a demonstrated need for the proposed use based on the past operation of the dwelling as a short-term rental unit.
- c. That with proper stormwater management, the proposed use will not degrade the water quality of the County.
- d. With no proposed construction, the proposed use will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
- e. With no proposed construction and service by municipal sewer system, the soils on the site are adequate to accommodate the proposed use.
- f. That with proper site management and ongoing management of vegetation, the proposed use will not create a potential pollution hazard.
- g. That adequate utility, access roads, drainage and stormwater management facilities have been provided.
- h. That adequate measures are provided for sufficient off-street parking and loading space to serve the proposed use as shown in the submitted application materials.
- i. That facilities are provided to eliminate any traffic congestion or traffic hazard which may result from the proposed use.
- j. That the interim use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted if the site is properly operated by the property manager and is not repeatedly rented to known violators of local, state, or federal regulations.
- k. That the establishment of the interim use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for the residential uses in the area.

- l. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to prevent or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise and vibration, so that none of these will constitute a nuisance, including limiting the location of outdoor fires to one location, not operating any other commercial use on the property, and enforcement of the submitted quiet hours.
- m. That several site-specific conditions and such other conditions are established as required for the protection of the public's health, safety, morals, and general welfare.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners that the Interim Use Permit to operate a Short-Term Rental Unit is hereby **GRANTED** with the following conditions:

1. The applicant shall comply with the standards of Section 24-337 – Short-term rental units, as amended, while the use is in operation.
2. The applicant shall operate the use within the parameters of the submitted business plan materials and the conditions of approval. Changes to the operation of the use from the submitted materials shall be reviewed by the Planning Agency for determination of whether review of the interim use permit is warranted by the Planning Commission and County Board.
3. No expansion of structures or additional impervious surfaces may be added to the property.
4. The applicant shall contact the Minnesota Department of Health and apply for any relevant permitting within 60 days of approval of the interim use permit by Blue Earth County. The applicant shall submit to the county the findings of the Minnesota Department of Health's review of the use for state permitting within six months of county approval.
5. All parking shall be provided on-site in the designated area. Short-term rental parking on Fair View Lane or in road right-of-way is prohibited.
6. Prior to May 15, 2023, the applicant shall allow Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Services staff access to review compliance of conditions associated with BOA 12-17, PC 16-17, and PC 05-23. Any non-compliant issues identified in inspection shall be brought into full compliance by the applicant prior July 1, 2023.
7. The owner and operator shall notify Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Resources Department when there is a change in ownership or management.
8. Because of the density of the neighborhood and the property owner's allowance of tenants' pets on the property, the property owner shall implement and enforce policies to restrict pets from roaming on to neighboring property, such as leashing and or fencing.
9. The maximum occupancy of the short-term rental unit shall be maintained and advertised by the property manager as 15 people.

This Interim Use Permit shall become effective immediately upon its passage and without publication.

Commissioner Bruender moved and Commissioner Piepho seconded to amend the motion to include no more than ten people on the property not including infants, two years and younger, and only allowing six cars in the driveway.

  3. Not repeatedly rented to known violators of local, state, or federal regulations.
- k. That the establishment of the interim use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for the residential uses in the area.
- l. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to prevent or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise and vibration, so that none of these will constitute a nuisance, including limiting the location of outdoor fires to one location, not operating any other commercial use on the property, and enforcement of the submitted quiet hours.
- m. That several site-specific conditions and such other conditions are established as required for the protection of the public's health, safety, morals, and general welfare.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners that the Interim Use Permit to operate a Short-Term Rental Unit is hereby **GRANTED** with the following conditions:

1. The applicant shall comply with the standards of Section 24-337 – Short-term rental units, as amended, while the use is in operation.
2. The applicant shall operate the use within the parameters of the submitted business plan materials and the conditions of approval. Changes to the operation of the use from the submitted materials shall be reviewed by the Planning Agency for determination of whether review of the interim use permit is warranted by the Planning Commission and County Board.
3. No expansion of structures or additional impervious surfaces may be added to the property.
4. The applicant shall contact the Minnesota Department of Health and apply for any relevant permitting within 60 days of approval of the interim use permit by Blue Earth County. The applicant shall submit to the county the findings of the Minnesota Department of Health’s review of the use for state permitting within six months of county approval.
5. All parking shall be provided on-site in the designated area. No more than 6 vehicles may be parked in the designated parking area. Short-term rental parking on Fair View Lane or in road right-of-way is prohibited.
6. Prior to May 15, 2023, the applicant shall allow Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Services staff access to review compliance of conditions associated with BOA 12-17, PC 16-17, and PC 05-23. Any non-compliant issues identified in inspection shall be brought into full compliance by the applicant prior July 1, 2023.
7. The owner and operator shall notify Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Resources Department when there is a change in ownership or management.
8. Because of the density of the neighborhood and the property owner's allowance of tenants' pets on the property, the property owner shall implement and enforce policies to restrict pets from roaming on to neighboring property, such as leashing and or fencing.
9. The maximum occupancy of the short-term rental unit shall be maintained and advertised by the property manager as 10 people, not including infants 2 years of age and younger, based upon the functionality of the road serving the property.

This Interim Use Permit shall become effective immediately upon its passage and without publication.

**RESOLUTION GRANTING APPROVAL OF AN INTERIM USE PERMIT TO OPERATE A SHORT-TERM RENTAL UNIT. THE PROPERTY IS ZONED AGRICULTURAL AND LOCATED WITHIN THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER OF THE SOUTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 3, LINCOLN TOWNSHIP – TOWNSHIP 107 N, RANGE 29 W.**

**WHEREAS**, Robert Schroeder and Michele Schroeder, owner of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, to wit:

Part of the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 3, Lincoln Township – Township 107 N, Range 29 W, Blue Earth County, Minnesota, as shown on Attachment A – Location Map; and

**WHEREAS**, Robert Schroeder and Michele Schroeder has made application for an interim use permit to operate a Short-Term Rental Unit; and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 09-23), a copy of said report has been presented to the Planning Commission; and,

**WHEREAS**, the request is consistent with the Blue Earth County Land Use Plan and Agricultural District, as authorized by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners; and,

**WHEREAS**; the Planning Commission of the County on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of March 2023, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to forward the matter to the County Board with a recommendation for approval subject to conditions contained in staff report PC 09-23 and,

**WHEREAS**; the County Board on the 21<sup>st</sup> Day of March 2023, held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to approve the request subject to conditions contained in staff report PC 09-23 and,

**WHEREAS**, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:



- a. The County Land Use Plan includes a Land Use Objective that states: Maintain ordinances that appropriately respond to the residential, agricultural, industrial and commercial trends of Blue Earth County. In response to pre-existing short-term-rentals (STR's) and anticipated growth of the industry, the ordinance was amended to allow STR's as an Interim Use with a specific set of performance standards.
- b. That there is a demonstrated need for the proposed use based on the applicant's use of a neighboring property as a reception hall. In addition, the proposed short-term-rental (STR) will serve members of the public having an interest the use of STR units.
- c. That with proper stormwater management and proper wastewater treatment, the proposed use will not likely degrade the water quality of the County.
- d. With no proposed construction, the proposed use will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
- e. With no proposed construction and compliance with SSTS standards, the soils on the site are adequate to accommodate the proposed use.
- f. That with proper site management, the proposed use will not create a potential pollution hazard.
- g. That adequate utility, access roads, drainage and stormwater management facilities have been provided.
- h. That adequate measures are provided for sufficient off-street parking and loading space to serve the proposed use as shown in the submitted application materials.
- i. That facilities are provided to eliminate any traffic congestion or traffic hazard which may result from the proposed use.
- j. That the interim use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted if the site is properly operated by the property manager and is not repeatedly rented to known violators of local, state, or federal regulations.
- k. That the establishment of the interim use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for agricultural or residential uses in the area.
- l. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to prevent or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise, and vibration, so that none of these will constitute a nuisance, including limiting the location of outdoor fires to one location, not operating any other commercial use on the property, and enforcement of the submitted quiet hours.

m. That site-specific conditions and such other conditions are established as required for the protection of the public's health, safety, morals, and general welfare.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners that the Interim Use Permit to operate a Short-Term Rental Unit is hereby **GRANTED** with the following conditions:

1. The applicant shall comply with the standards of Section 24-337 – Short-term rental units, as amended, while the use is in operation.
2. The applicant shall operate the use within the parameters of the submitted business plan materials, as amended by conditions of this Interim Use Permit related to the occupancy limit, and the septic system serving the property.
3. The maximum occupancy shall be limited whichever is less of the following three items: Six guests based on the existing septic system, unless upgraded. The designed occupancy of a replacement septic system with a sizing factor of 75 gallons per day per guest. Or when applicable, the limitations placed by the Minnesota Department of health. Advertising to accommodate more than six guests while the current septic system is in place will cause the Planning Agency to determine whether review of the interim use permit is warranted by the Planning Commission and County Board.
4. The applicant shall contact the Minnesota Department of Health and apply for any relevant permitting within 60 days of approval of the interim use permit by Blue Earth County. The applicant shall submit to the county the findings of the Minnesota Department of Health's review of the use for state permitting within six months of county approval.
5. All parking shall be provided on-site in the designated area.
6. The property owners and property manager shall allow Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Resources Department access to ensure conditions of this permit are being met.
7. The owner and operator shall notify Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Resources Department when there is a change in ownership or management.

This Interim Use Permit shall become effective immediately upon its passage and without publication.

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**NOTICE OF UNAUTHORIZED OUTLET  
AND ORDER TO BLOCK OUTLET OR  
OTHERWISE MAKE OUTLET  
INEFFECTIVE**

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PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 103E.401, subd. 7, you are the owner of property where an unauthorized outlet into County Ditch 36 is located. This notice is being sent to you based on the following findings made by the Blue Earth County Drainage Authority, the Drainage Authority for County Ditch 36.

**Findings:**

1. Blue Earth County is the drainage authority for County Ditch 36.
2. On October 4, 2022, an email from the tile contractor, Jay Engles, with Gustafson Drainage LLC., was received by the Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Resources Department. On October 19, 2022, Drainage Management staff discovered that a very large amount of newly installed private tile was providing an outlet for drainage into County Ditch 36, from unassessed lands located in the following locations:
  - a. Nancy Heinze property currently authorized to outlet into County Ditch 36 public drainage system includes part of the South Half of the Southeast Quarter of

Section 12, Butternut Valley Township, Blue Earth County, containing 4.6 acres of benefited land, authorized to outlet in County Ditch 36.

- b. The remaining 53.83 acres of the Nancy Heinze property, as described in the following: E120 OF SE4 S & W OF LN BEG 1795.8'S OF NECOR SE4 W462' N598.08' W TO W LN OF E120A EX 1.57A ROW 012 108 29, is outleting through an unauthorized outlet source, County Ditch 36.
3. According to the records provided and maintained by Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Resources Drainage Management staff, located at Blue Earth County Government Center Building, 410 South 5<sup>th</sup>. Street, P.O. Box 3566, Mankato, Minnesota, 56002, the 53.83 acres of Nancy Heinze property, as previously described, is unassessed property, and is not within the benefited and assessed area of County Ditch 36 and has not petitioned for express authority to use County Ditch 36 as an outlet.

**Order:**

Based on the foregoing Findings and the entire record of proceedings before the Board, the Board, acting as the Drainage Authority for County Ditch 36, hereby orders as follows:

That the property owner listed, and properties described previously, is hereby ordered to take the following actions:

1. Block the outlet or otherwise make the outlet of any and all private tile outleting into County Ditch 36, via private tile, for all acres outside of the 4.6 acres benefited by County Ditch 36, ineffective on or before April 21, 2023, or within 30 days of approval of this order.
2. Discontinue use of outleting additional unbenefited acres, 53.83 acres, into County Ditch 36 public drainage system as an outlet for the unassessed properties until:
  - a. An outlet fee is paid as determined by the drainage authority based on the benefits received by the unassessed properties for the period the unauthorized outlet was operational; and
  - b. A petition is filed with the drainage authority for express authority to use the outlet, the petition is approved by the drainage authority after a public hearing, and an outlet fee established.

**PLEASE TAKE FURTHER NOTICE:** that if you do not block or make the outlet ineffective within the time period required in this notice, the drainage authority will issue an order without further notice to have the work performed to bring the outlet into compliance. After the work is completed, the drainage authority will send a statement to the auditor of Blue Earth County, containing the expenses incurred to bring the outlet into compliance and the outlet fee based on the benefits received by the property during the period the unauthorized outlet was operational. Said expenses and outlet fee will be filed as a drainage lien on the tax list for your property the following year pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 103E.401, subd. 8(a).

## **HUMAN SERVICES**

Mr. Phil Claussen, Human Services Director, presented the following items to the Board:

Commissioner Bruender moved and Commissioner O'Connor seconded the motion to approve the following:

**Blue Earth Taxi.** The purpose of this contract is for Blue Earth Taxi to provide transportation services for Medical Assistance clients to attend medical and dental appointments, pick up prescriptions, etc. Blue Earth Taxi provides transportation to our fee-for-service clients (non- PMAP). The County is required to provide transportation to our clients who receive Medical Assistance. The rates are mandated by the State. Blue Earth Taxi will abide by those rates. The rates will be the same for all other transportation providers serving these people in our community. The State has not changed the transportation rates from 2022 to 2023. The term of the contract is April 1, 2023, to December 31, 2023.

**Partners for Housing: Purchase of Service Agreement** The purpose of this agreement is for Blue Earth County to contract with Partners for Housing to provide support and recovery services offered at Theresa House and the Welcome Inn as delivered by a case aide position hired through Partners for Housing. The agreement supplies funds to support the staffing position to perform additional supportive services at the two named shelters above. This is a renewal agreement from the Blue Earth County Board for the specific purpose to support services at the shelters with the amount being \$30,000.00 annually, which is the same as the previous year. The term is January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2023.

**2023 Blue Earth County Fee Policy.** Human Services is recommending to the Board that adjustments to the Human Service Fee Policy and Procedure Manual are adopted for 2023. Please refer to slides for recommended changes to the Fee Policy, and the attachment for the entire Fee Policy.

**Page 7:** Corrected “Mental Health Center Coordinator” to new position of “Human Services Supervisor – Mental Health Center”.

**Page 9:** Added paragraph to clarify that Level II (OBRA) administrative fees (assessments) do not apply to spenddowns or deductibles:

Changed “Child Fee” language to “Child’s Cost of Care” throughout

**Page 11:** Revised “Child Fee” language pursuant to law changes to Minn. Stat. §§ 260B.331, 260C.331, and 518A.43. Implementing new sliding fee (Appendix D) to determine child’s cost of care:

*“Child’s Cost of Care: Is the monthly unearned income of the child. Examples of a child’s monthly unearned income would include, but not limited to, adoption assistance, child support, Social Security benefits, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), trusts, investments, veteran’s benefits, railroad retirement benefits, and insurance.*

- a. *The child’s cost of care is considered the full monthly amount of his/her unearned income as noted above, up to the cost of placement.*
- b. *A child’s cost of care will be based on the best interests of the child and determined based on the custodial parent’s Adjusted Gross Income (AGI), which must be submitted in every out-of-home placement case, in correlation with the sliding fee (See Appendix D). The provided information will be reviewed, and the client (custodial parent) will be notified in writing once the determination has been made.*
  - (1) *If client fails to provide the requested information within sixty (60) days of the initial request, the child’s cost of care will remain at full amount of the child’s unearned income.*
- c. *If the child’s cost of care is assessed, a personal needs amount is allowed by the Agency when this item is not built into the daily rate.*

- d. *The child's cost of care will be prorated based on the number of the days in placement."*

**Page 16:** Added the following language to Fee Policy regarding Yellow Line Project cost of participation:

- 1. *Officer-Involved Community-Based Care Coordination (OICC)*  
*The cost of participation in the Yellow Line Project does not apply to spenddowns or deductibles.*

**Resolution Authorizing Blue Earth County Staff to Execute All Necessary Documents to Ensure Blue Earth County Participation in the Multistate Settlements Relating to Opioid Supply Chain Participants, and in the Minnesota Opioids State-Subdivision Memorandum of Agreement.**

WHEREAS, the State of Minnesota and numerous Minnesota cities and counties are engaged in nationwide civil litigation against opioid supply chain participants related to the opioid crisis; and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Attorney General has signed on to multistate settlement agreements with several opioid supply chain participants, but those settlement agreements are still subject to sign-on by local governments and final agreement by the companies and approval by the courts; and

WHEREAS, there is a deadline of April, 18 2023, for a sufficient threshold of Minnesota cities and counties to sign on to the above-referenced multistate settlement agreements, and failure to timely sign on may diminish the amount of funds received by not only that city or county but by all Minnesota cities and counties from the settlement funds; and

WHEREAS, representatives of Minnesota's local governments, the Office of the Attorney General, and the State of Minnesota have reached agreement on the intrastate allocation of these settlement funds between the State, and the counties and cities, as well as the permissible uses of these funds, which will be memorialized in the Minnesota Opioids State-Subdivision Memorandum of Agreement, as amended (the "State-Subdivision Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the State-Subdivision Agreement creates an opportunity for local governments and the State to work collaboratively on a unified vision to deliver a robust abatement and remediation plan to address the opioid crisis in Minnesota;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, Blue Earth County supports and agrees to the State-Subdivision Agreement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Blue Earth County supports and opts into all future multistate settlement agreements with opioid supply chain participants; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners authorizes Blue Earth County staff to execute all necessary documents to ensure Blue Earth County participation in the multistate settlement agreements, including the Participation Agreement and accompanying Release, and in the State-Subdivision Agreement.
