BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
BLUE EARTH COUNTY, MINNESOTA**

June 20, 2023

The County Board of Commissioners met in the Commissioners' Room at 9:00 AM.

Present were Commissioners Kip Bruender, Kevin Paap, Patty O'Connor and Vance Stuehrenberg. Also present were County Administrator Robert Meyer, County Attorney Pat McDermott, and Administrative Assistant Stephanie Jahnke.

The meeting was called to order.

PLEDGE

All present said the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

AGENDA REVIEW

Commissioner O'Connor moved and Commissioner Bruender seconded the motion to approve the agenda. The motion carried. 2023-158

PLANNING AND ZONING

Mr. Garret Rohlfing, Land Use Planner, George Leary, Senior Land Use Planner, Scott Salsbury, Senior Land Use Planner, Dane Lynch, Environmental Health Specialist – Wetlands, and John Considine, Senior Land Use Planner, presented the following items to the Board:

A public comment period was allowed for each of the following items. No comments were heard unless otherwise noted.

Commissioner Bruender moved and Commissioner Paap seconded the motion to approve the following:

RESOLUTION GRANTING APPROVAL OF A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT TO EXPAND AN EXISTING FEEDLOT OWNED BY MARKS FARMS INC. THE

EXPANSION WILL INCLUDE ONE NEW TOTAL CONFINEMENT POULTRY BARN AND ONE NEW SOLID MANURE STORAGE SHED. THE NEW BARN WILL HOUSE 200,000 LAYING HENS UNDER 5 POUNDS WHICH IS AN EQUIVALENT OF 600 ANIMAL UNITS. THE EXPANSION WILL INCREASE THE PERMITTED CAPACITY TOTAL FROM 145,000 LAYING HENS (435 ANIMAL UNITS) TO 315,000 LAYING HENS (935 ANIMAL UNITS). THE PROPERTY IS LOCATED IN BLUE EARTH COUNTY, IS ZONED AGRICULTURAL, AND IS LOCATED IN PART OF THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER OF SECTION 15, MAPLETON TOWNSHIP, BLUE EARTH COUNTY, MINNESOTA. (T-105-N, R-26-W)

WHEREAS, Marks Farms Inc, owner of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, to wit:

Part of the Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 15, Mapleton Township. Township 105 N, Range 26 W, Blue Earth County, Minnesota, as shown on Attachment A – Location Map.

WHEREAS, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 08-23), a copy of said report has been presented to the Planning Commission; and,

WHEREAS, the request is consistent with the Land Use Plan, and Agricultural District Conditional Uses, as authorized by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners; and,

WHEREAS; the Planning Commission of the County on the 7th Day of June 2023, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to forward the matter to the County Board with a recommendation for approval subject to conditions contained in staff report PC 08-23 and,

WHEREAS; the County Board on the 20th Day of June 2023, held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to approve the request subject to conditions contained in staff report PC 08-23 and,

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. *The Blue Earth County Land Use Plan supports the agricultural economy, which includes farming operations of all scales and those industries which directly support agriculture. Since this proposal has an approved setback variance and features contained solid manure storage, there are no conflicts with the Land Use Plan.*

2. *The applicant has stated there is more demand for egg production and would be unable to expand his existing feedlot without the granting of the Conditional Use Permit. The applicant has also expressed that the location of this barn will utilize existing infrastructure from barns that previously existed.*
3. *The facility features total confinement barns, and all manure/litter will be conveyed into a manure storage shed where it will be stockpiled until Manure is land applied. On occasion manure will be stockpiled in agricultural fields until the crops have been harvested. If all setbacks and standards are followed, the proposal will not degrade the water quality of the county.*
4. *In the proposed project area, there is approximately 1.51 acres of existing impervious surface. The proposed expansion will increase the total impervious surface area by approximately 0.79 acres. Stormwater from the proposed expansion will be directed to an existing stormwater basin on the property, therefore the proposed use should not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.*
5. *The barn and manure storage shed are being proposed in areas that have already been developed or soils have been altered. Also, the Blue Earth County Wetland Specialist did not have any concerns with the proposed location of the expansion, therefore the soils appear to be adequate to accommodate the proposed use.*
6. *All manure from the existing site and expansion will be stored inside of a manure storage shed. At times manure may be stockpiled in an agricultural field prior to crops being harvested. Provided setbacks are maintained, there does not appear to be any potential pollution hazards. The site will be monitored in the future for any pollution hazards by the Blue Earth County Feedlot Officer and the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency. Any potential pollution hazards will be addressed on a case-by-case basis.*
7. *Adequate access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have already been provided. Stormwater drainage will be improved with the proposed expansion.*
8. *The existing driveway/parking area can provide parking areas for workers and load-out trucks so there will be no blocking of the roadway.*
9. *While there may be some increase in traffic from the proposed use, it should not create any congestion. There appears to be adequate parking to accommodate incoming and outgoing trucks onsite, so there should not be any hazards created from on-street parking.*
10. *The proposed barn and manure storage shed were granted a variance to reduce the feedlot to dwelling setback from three different residences. The proposed expansion meets all other applicable setbacks, does not exceed maximum capacity standards, and is located in the Agricultural Zoning District where animal feedlots are a Conditional Use. These facts,*

also considering the property already has a feedlot permit, confirm that the granting of this Conditional Use Permit will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other properties in the area.

11. *Neighboring properties are predominantly cropland with a mix of non-agricultural dwellings. Any future residential development would require adherence to the feedlot-dwelling setback standards, but non-residential development would not be limited by any further setbacks.*
12. *The applicant will be required to follow all Blue Earth County and Minnesota Pollution Control Agency regulations regarding feedlot construction and operation. Manure will be stored indoors which will help prevent odors that may come from the site.*
13. For the protection of the public's health, safety, morals, and general welfare, site-specific conditions have been recommended with this report.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners that the Conditional Use Permit to construct one 200,000 head total confinement layer hen barn, one egg cooling room, and one solid manure storage shed is hereby **GRANTED** with the following conditions:

1. That the total confinement barn conforms to the site plan attached to this report (PC 08-23).
2. That the feedlot be located on a single, legally described parcel consisting of a minimum of 10 contiguous acres or as amended in the Blue Earth County Feedlot Ordinance. The parcel shall be a parcel of record, properly recorded in the Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Resources Office.
3. That the applicant must obtain a Blue Earth County Feedlot Permit before any animals are placed in the barn.
4. Prior to the issuance of a construction permit, the applicant shall submit the following to the Property & Environmental Resources Department:
 - The final Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan
 - A copy of the MPCA Construction Stormwater Permit, approved by the MPCA.
5. That the applicant obtains a Blue Earth County Construction Permit before building begins and within one (1) year from the date the County Board of Commissioners approves the Conditional Use Permit. The permit shall be rendered invalid if application for a Construction Permit is not made within this one (1) year period. Time extensions for Conditional Use Permits must be obtained from the County Board of Commissioners subsequent to a public hearing conducted by the Planning Commission.

6. If required by the Department of Natural Resources, the applicant shall obtain a DNR “Water Appropriations Permit” before any animals are placed in the barn.
7. The application of manure shall comply with standards set forth by the MPCA and the County. The applicants manure management plan must be reviewed by the operator each year and updated each year and adjusted for any changes in the amount of manure production, manure nutrient test results and transfer of manure ownership. Records of manure transfer shall be maintained as required by the MPCA.
8. That the disposal of dead animals be consistent with the Minnesota Board of Animal Health regulations, and when rendering is used as a mortality disposal the applicant shall provide an enclosed location for the pick-up.
9. That adequate measures be taken to minimize or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise, or vibrations so that none of these will constitute a nuisance.
10. That MPCA construction Best Management Practices shall be followed including erosion control measures.
11. That all exposed earthen surfaces be seeded into grass or utilized as crop acreage.
12. If shower, restroom, culinary and/or laundry facilities are to be included with the proposal, that wastewater handling practices are designed and constructed according to state requirements.
13. As-built drawings prepared by a qualified professional shall be submitted to the Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Resources Department within 30 days of completion of the stormwater system to certify the stormwater system was constructed as shown in the Construction Plans and SWPPP.

WHEREAS, Kristen L. and Joseph Friedrichs, owners of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, to wit:

As defined on the Preliminary Plat of Friedrichs Farms; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 12-23), a copy of said report has been presented to the Planning Commission; and,

WHEREAS; the Planning Commission of the County on the 7th day of June 2023, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to forward the matter to the County Board with a recommendation for approval subject to conditions included in staff report PC 12-23 and,

WHEREAS; the County Board on the 20th day of June 2023, held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to approve the request subject to conditions included in staff report PC 12-23 and,

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. That the proposed Preliminary Plat conforms with the County Land Use Plan which states: “The County will support orderly growth and limit the development of uses that may eventually require the extension of urban utilities outside of municipal areas.”
2. That the proposed Preliminary Plat conforms with the Land Division Chapter and the Zoning Chapter of the County Code.
3. That the proposed Preliminary Plat will not degrade the water quality of the county.
4. That the proposed Preliminary Plat will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
5. That the proposed Preliminary Plat does not create a potential pollution hazard.
6. That the proposed Preliminary Plat will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.

1. That any amendments to the Preliminary Plat shall be submitted for review with the submittal of a Final Plat application.

That the Preliminary Plat approval shall be valid for 12-months as required by the Land Division Chapter of the County.

WHEREAS, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 17-23), a copy of said report has been presented to the Planning Commission; and,

WHEREAS; the Planning Commission of the County on the 7th day of June 2023, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to forward the matter to the County Board with a recommendation for approval subject to conditions included in staff report PC 17-23 and,

That prior to submittal of an application for review and approval of the Final Plat, the applicants shall formally vacate the unused utility easement running between lots 14 and 15 of Terrace View Subdivision. An updated copy of the Preliminary Plat shall be provided with the application for the Final Plat.
2. That any amendments to the Preliminary Plat shall be submitted for review with the submittal of a Final Plat application.
3. That the Preliminary Plat approval shall be valid for 12-months as required by the Land Division Chapter of the County.
4. That the non-complying septic system serving 306 Terrace View West shall be upgraded prior to July 1, 2024.

5. That a septic easement shall be properly recorded for the proposed septic drainfield to serve the existing house on the proposed Lot 1 and to be located on proposed Lot 2.

Commissioner Bruender moved and Commissioner O'Connor seconded the motion to approve the following:

Resolution granting approval of an After-the-Fact Interim Use Permit to allow for the cutting and filling on a bluff for a shoreland mobility path. The site is zoned Rural Townsite, is in the Urban Fringe Overlay District of the City of Mankato, and is in the Shoreland of Ballantyne Lake, a Recreational Development Lake as classified by the MN Department of Natural Resources. The property includes Lot 3 Block 1 of Hager's Lake Ballantyne Subdivision and is in the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 28, Jamestown Township – Township 109 N, Range 25 W.

WHEREAS, William S. Bielen, owner of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, to wit:

Lot 3 Block 1 of Hager’s Lake Ballantyne Subdivision located in part of the Southwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 28, Jamestown Township – Township 109 N, Range 25 W, Blue Earth County, Minnesota, as shown on Attachment A – Location Map; and

WHEREAS, the owner has made application for an interim use permit to allow cutting and filling in a bluff zone to allow the construction of a mobility path; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 18-23), a copy of said report has been presented to the Planning Commission; and

WHEREAS, the request is consistent with the Blue Earth County Land Use Plan and Rural Townsite District, as authorized by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners; and,

WHEREAS; the Planning Commission of the County on the 7th day of June 2023, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to forward the matter to the County Board with a recommendation for approval subject to conditions contained in staff report PC 18-23 and,

WHEREAS; the County Board on the 20th Day of June 2023, held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to approve the request subject to conditions contained in staff report PC 18-23 and,

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

- a. That the proposed After the Fact Interim Use Permit are consistent with the Land Use Plan and the Natural Resources Objective which states the proposed grading work to establish a stable slope and plant prairie grasses is consistent with that objective.
- b. That there is a demonstrated need for the shoreland mobility path due to the applicant’s health condition which is consistent with Section 14-111 (b)(3)f. that allows paths for physically handicapped persons for achieving access to shore areas.

- c. That the engineered path and associated slope stabilization plans and erosion control plans will not degrade the water quality of the county.
- d. That the establishment of the prairie grass side slopes and requirement of any shrubs and trees removed must be replaced, the proposed use will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
- e. According to the Web Soil Survey, the soils appear to be adequate for this proposal. The existing soils on the site are bare and with the re-establishment of more gradual and vegetated slopes as proposed, the soil conditions are adequate for the proposed use.
- f. That with proper site management and ongoing management of vegetation, the proposed use does not create a potential pollution hazard.
- g. Adequate access roads to the property exist. Adequate drainage and stormwater management practices have been provided by the engineered plan to accommodate the proposed use.
- h. The applicants' property provides sufficient off-street parking for construction crews while the work is being completed.
- i. While there may be some increased truck traffic during the construction of the mobility path, it will only be for a short period of time and should not create any traffic congestion or traffic hazards.
- j. The removal and placement of fill for the creation of a driveway should not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
- k. The proposed mobility path will not impede the development or improvement of property in the area and will not impact the neighboring property owners.
- l. Once completed, the proposed use should not generate any of the listed issues which could constitute a nuisance. Therefore, it is unlikely that this proposed project would create any disturbance for the neighboring property owners.
- m. The protection of the public's health, safety, morals, and general welfare are addressed in the conditions shown below.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners that the Interim Use Permit to allow for the cutting and filling on a bluff for a shoreland mobility path is hereby **GRANTED** with the following conditions:

1. That the area of disturbance of the project shall not exceed the limits shown on the applicants engineered site plan.
2. That any change from the engineer in the applicant's engineered plan shall be reviewed and approved by the Property and Environmental Resources Department prior to implementation. Major changes shall be brought to the Planning Commission and County Board for review.
3. That the applicant exposes the property pins along the north property line of Lot 3 Block 1 of Hager's Lake Ballantyne Subdivision prior to starting construction on the project.
4. That the applicant provides Property and Environmental Resources with an as-built construction report from the engineer, documenting the project was constructed according to the engineered plans, and with an as-built drawing of the completed elevation contours from the engineer prior to seeding the permanent vegetation.
5. All necessary erosion control measures shall be installed prior to the commencement of this proposed project to prevent erosion from entering Ballantyne Lake. This may include mulch berms of appropriate height and width, erosion control logs that are properly placed, or silt fence that is properly staked and trenched in. The erosion control shall remain in place until vegetation is sufficiently established on the path side slopes.
6. That the prairie plantings be maintained in accordance with the guidelines of the Board of Water and Soil Resources including mowing at a height of 5-8 inches during the first two years and spot herbicide treatments after the second year.
7. That the applicant provides copies of the seed labels and number of trees and shrubs removed and replaced to the Property and Environmental Resources Department within 30 days after seeding and replacement of trees and shrubs.
8. That the applicant does not install low voltage or solar power lighting along the path for nighttime illumination to keep the path inconspicuous in the dark.
9. That the applicant notifies Property and Environmental Resources staff when the construction is complete.

**RESOLUTION REVOKING CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT PC 35-21, WHICH
GRANTED THE APPROVAL TO OPERATE A SOURCE-SEPARATED ORGANIC
MATERIAL COMPOST FACILITY**

WHEREAS, MFS Recycling Land LLC (hereinafter MFS) (CFD) (owners of the following real estate) in the County of Blue Earth, State of Minnesota, to-wit:

Part of the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 1, Lyra Township. Township 106 N, Range 27 W, as shown on Attachment A – Location Map;

WHEREAS, MFS has a Conditional Use Permit PC 35-21 for a Source-Separated Organic Material (hereinafter SSOM) compost facility. Permitted activities include composting SSOM, mixing the finished SSOM compost with composted dairy manure, gypsum, and calcite to create a final product for land application, and to accept recycling materials as an accessory use. The property is zoned agriculture and is in the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 1, Lyra Township (T-106-N, R-27-W).

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Planning Agency has completed a review of compliance for PC 35-21 and made a report pertaining to said review of compliance (PC 16-23), a copy of said report has been presented to the Blue Earth County Planning Commission;

WHEREAS, Blue Earth County Staff has observed offensive nuisance-level odors emanating from the MFS compost facility to neighboring property, multiple households have submitted complaints regarding odors emanating from the MFS compost facility to their property, and the MFS compost facility has submitted ineffective odor action plans to the County with no impact on observed offensive nuisance-level odor as detailed in the PC 16-23 Staff report;

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes Section 394.301, subdivision 3, states that a conditional use permit shall remain in effect for so long as the conditions agreed upon are observed;

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Planning Agency has determined that the MFS compost facility has been operating in violation of Condition 14 of PC 35-21 due to ineffective odor mitigation measures resulting in nuisance-level odors. The Condition 14 states: “Operating procedures and adequate measures shall be utilized in accordance with State of Minnesota Permits and County License(s) to ensure the use of the property does not constitute a nuisance. This shall include, but is not limited to, odor mitigation measures such as pond aerators which shall be implemented in accordance with County licensing requirements.”;

WHEREAS, County Staff notified the operators of the MFS compost facility throughout 2022 and 2023 that the MFS compost facility was being operated in violation of PC 35-21 and allowed the MFS compost facility sufficient time to rectify the violation;

WHEREAS, while SSOM compost facilities are not an agricultural use, they are allowed as a conditional use in Chapter 24, Section 24-112, provided the conditions of the conditional use permit are observed;

WHEREAS, Chapter 24, Section 24-111 b. of the Blue Earth County Code of Ordinances states that “Owners of property, residents, other users of property in the agriculture zone, and neighboring properties adjacent to the agriculture zone may be subjected to inconvenience or discomfort arising from normal and accepted agricultural practices and operations including, but not limited to; noise, odors, dust, operation of aircraft and late night operation of farm machinery, the storage and application of manure, fertilizers, soil amendments, herbicides and pesticides associated with normal agricultural operations.”;

WHEREAS, The Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners authorized the Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Resources Department to be responsible for issuance of a Solid Waste Management Facility License for the MFS compost facility and to be responsible for monitoring the facility for compliance;

WHEREAS, the process for revocation of PC 35-21 is consistent with the Blue Earth County Land Use Plan and Section 24-47 of the Blue Earth County Code, as authorized by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners;

WHEREAS, on June 7, 2023, the Blue Earth County Planning Commission, after proper and adequate notice, held a public hearing regarding the request for revocation of PC 35-21, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted four to three in favor of forwarding a recommendation of revocation of PC 35-21, subject to the conditions contained in staff report PC 16-23 to the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners;

WHEREAS, on June 20, 2023, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners held a public hearing regarding the request to revoke PC 35-21, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted to revoke PC 35-21, subject to conditions contained in Staff report PC 16-23 and,

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

- j. That the use is injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
As of May 2, 2023, County Staff received 164 complaints regarding offensive odor from the MFS compost facility from 37 different households since approval of PC 35-21. As outlined in the Staff report, County Staff observed offensive nuisance-level odors on 62 days from May 19, 2022, to May 2, 2023. Therefore, the use appears to be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
- l. That adequate measures have not been taken to prevent or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise, and vibration, so that none of these will constitute a nuisance, and to control lighted signs and other lights in such a manner that no disturbance to neighboring properties will result.

The MFS compost facility has not achieved control of offensive, nuisance-level odor emanating from the MFS compost facility despite multiple odor control plans, elimination of specific materials, varying weather and seasons, and different facility operators, as evidenced by County Staff off-site field observations. Therefore, the use of the SSOM at the MFS compost facility constitutes a nuisance.

- n. That the intensity of commercial or industrial development is greater than the intensity of the surrounding uses and greater than the intensity characteristic of the Agricultural Zoned District. *The use of commercial or industrial materials in the composting process and the ineffective operating procedures to mitigate odor in the operation of the MFS compost facility has created an intensity of use that is greater than the intensity of the surrounding uses.*
- o. That site-specific conditions and such other conditions were established as required for the protection of the public's health, safety, morals, and general welfare. *As evidenced by County Staff off-site field observations identifying year-round offensive nuisance-level odors emanating from the MFS compost facility, the public's health, safety, and general welfare have not been protected from offensive nuisance-level odors due to noncompliance with Condition 14 of PC 35-21, which required operating procedures and adequate measures, including odor mitigation measures, to ensure the use does not constitute a nuisance.*

Staff proposes the findings below, which reflect compliance with Blue Earth County standards for required findings in Chapter 24, Section 24-47 of the Blue Earth County Code.

- a. That the use conforms with the county land use plan. *The Community Resilience Chapter of the Blue Earth County Land Use Plan states that municipal solid waste (MSW) generation in Blue Earth County continues to grow with residential and business waste generated in Blue Earth County, increasing with population and business growth. MSW includes garbage, recyclables, yard waste, household hazardous waste, and bulky waste such as furniture. The use reduces the amount of material entering the landfill system and provides a recycling option for area businesses. Therefore, the use appears to be in harmony with the Blue Earth County Land Use Plan.*
- b. The demonstrated need for the use. *Providing an option for composting SSOM will reduce the amount of material entering the landfill system. In addition, the finished product can be land applied as a soil amendment. Therefore, there appears to be a need for the use.*
- c. That the use will not degrade the water quality of the county. *A stormwater pond on the north end of the facility collects stormwater from the north end of the MFS compost facility. The normal water elevation of the stormwater pond is 987 feet. The discharge from the pond is controlled by an eight-inch orifice at 987.0 feet and a weir wall at an elevation of 990.0 feet. The pond has a high-water elevation of 989 feet from back-to-back*

100-year storm events. The discharge of the stormwater is to an underground drain tile system. A contact water pond at the south end of the MFS compost facility collects stormwater that comes in contact with composting windrows and feedstock piles on the southern end of the MFS compost facility. The contact water pond is tested prior to land application. In the event the pond does not meet Minnesota Pollution Control Agency discharge standards, the water can be hauled to a wastewater treatment plant. Therefore, it appears the use will not degrade the water quality in Blue Earth County.

- d. That the use will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
A stormwater pond on the north end of the MFS compost facility collects stormwater from the north end of the MFS compost facility. The normal water elevation of the stormwater pond is 987 feet. The discharge from the pond is controlled by an eight-inch orifice at 987.0 feet and a weir wall at an elevation of 990.0 feet. The pond has a high-water elevation of 989 feet from back-to-back 100-year storm events. The discharge of the stormwater is to an underground drain tile system. A contact water pond at the south end of the MFS compost facility was designed for a 24-hour – 100-year storm event. Therefore, it appears the use will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
- e. That soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the use.
Prior to the initial construction of the MFS compost facility in 2012, numerous soil borings were taken and used for the design of the ponds and MFS compost facility. Therefore, it appears that soil conditions are adequate for the MFS compost facility.
- f. That the use does not create a potential pollution hazard.
With proper maintenance of the stormwater and contact water ponds, timely cleanup of loose recyclable and non-recyclable materials, timely and proper cleanup of any accidental spills, and proper inspection and quality control of all incoming loads of SSOM and recyclable material, the project should not create a pollution hazard.
- g. That adequate utility, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or are being provided.
Adequate utility, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities were addressed with the initial construction of the MFS compost facility in 2012.
- h. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide sufficient off-street parking and loading space to serve the use.
Adequate off-street parking and loading areas are provided at the MFS compost facility.
- i. That facilities are provided to eliminate any traffic congestion or traffic hazard which may result from the use.
With sufficient off-street parking and adequate dust control on the road leading to and from the MFS compost facility, the potential traffic congestion or traffic hazards of County Road 165 should be comparable to other similar gravel roads.

k. That the use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for predominant uses in the area.

There are no setback requirements to a SSOM compost facility. Therefore, the use does not appear likely to impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for predominant uses in the area.

m. That the density of proposed residential development is not greater than the density of the surrounding neighborhood or not greater than the density indicated by the applicable zoning district.

This standard does not apply to this request.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that because the MFS compost facility is in violation of Condition 14 of PC 35-21 to operate a Source-Separated Organic Material (SSOM) composting facility, and to mix the SSOM compost with composted dairy manure, gypsum and calcite to create a final product for land application, and to accept recycling materials as an accessory use located in the Agricultural Zoned District of the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 1, Lyra Township, PC 35-21 is **REVOKED**, with the following conditions:

- A. Public notice of intent to cease operations shall be posted at the entrance of the compost facility indicating the date of closure and providing a listing of other facilities accepting similar materials.
- B. No new material shall be brought on site after two-weeks from the date of revocation of the conditional use permit.
- C. The site ownership shall be responsible for communicating and executing all required state agency processes for closure of the facility. MFS must follow MPCA closure processes in accordance with their August 2012 permit and MN rules 7001 and 7035.
- D. The SSOM compost facility operator shall provide access to County Staff to inspect and inventory material on site upon the date materials are no longer accepted.
- E. No new material may be mixed to create new compost windrows after two-weeks from the date of revocation of the conditional use permit. Material already mixed may continue to follow the Process to Further Reduce Pathogens (PFRP) process, screening, and follow the curing process for up to three months. All materials on-site must be processed and properly disposed of according to all County and State regulations.
- F. The contact water pond will be pumped and disposed of as specified by County and State regulations. The pond will be dredged to remove excess detritus material and then be filled in with clean soil.
- G. The two 20,000-gallon tanks will be pumped, and the contents will be disposed of as specified by County and State regulations.
- H. Calcium chloride shall be applied to the entire approved hauling route one time between
 - a. July 1, 2023, and August 31, 2023 and;
 - b. September 1, 2023, and October 31, 2023

Documentation of the application of dust control shall be submitted to the County within 10 days of application.

- I. Recyclable materials will be re-moved and disposed of as specified by County and State regulations.
- J. Trucks used in hauling material from the site shall have their loads covered and be loaded in such manner as to minimize spillage onto public roadways.
- K. No new or additional use may occur on the property during the closure time frame. The decommissioning of the compost facility includes the continued composting use. Therefore, the property will remain with an active violation until all material used in the composting operation is removed from the site and operations have ceased.
- L. A final site inspection, with all appropriate jurisdictional organizations, shall be conducted upon final closure of the facility. All conditions of revocation shall be met and the use of a SSOM compost facility shall fully cease within five months of revocation of the conditional use permit. The Letter of Irrevocable Credit will remain in place until it is no longer needed.
- M. MFS must provide a written report to the County and State that summarizes compliance with completing Items A through L, and include documentation for Conditions A, C, E, F, G, H, I, and L.

At a public meeting conducted by the Blue Earth County Board, sitting as the Drainage Authority for County Ditch 26, on June 20, 2023, it was moved and seconded to adopt the following Findings and Order:

Findings:

1. The Blue Earth County Board is the Drainage Authority for County Ditch 26.
2. On February 6, 2023, the Property and Environmental Resources Department received a petition requesting to abandon portions of County Ditch 26 pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 103E.806. The portion of the drainage system sought to be abandoned is described as follows:

The open ditch portion of County Ditch 26 in the East half of the Southeast Quarter and the Southwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 9 of McPherson Township, T107N, R25W.
3. The Petition asserts that the part of the drainage system proposed to be abandoned does not serve a substantial useful purpose as part of the drainage system to any property remaining in the system and is not of substantial public benefit and utility.
4. The Petition for Partial Abandonment is in proper form and is legally sufficient and adequate for the purposes of these proceedings.
5. The Drainage Authority set a public hearing for the Petition to take place on June 20, 2023 at 9:00 a.m. at the 2nd floor, Board of Commissioner’s room at the Blue Earth County Historic Courthouse, 204 South 5th St., Mankato, MN and directed staff to give notice of the hearing by mail to the owners of all property benefited by the drainage system and to give notice by publication in a newspaper of general circulation within the affected drainage area or by publication on a website of the Drainage Authority.
6. Notice of the public hearing was properly provided as required by law. Evidence of all notice provided for the hearing is on file with the Drainage Authority.
7. The petitioners were allowed to make a presentation at the public hearing.

8. The hearing was opened for public comment.
9. The drainage system serves a substantial useful purpose as part of the drainage system to property remaining in the system and is of a substantial public benefit and utility.
10. As the petitioned portion of County Ditch 26 serves as the outlet for the system, Blue Earth County Drainage Management staff recommends the petitioned lands not be abandoned.
11. The abandonment was discussed at a landowner meeting held on March 14, 2023. After discussions at the meeting, Attorney Kale Van Bruggen stated he could not recommend the approval of the petition for abandonment.

Findings:

1. A Petition dated August 22, 2022, and Surety Bond in the amount of \$50,000 was received by the Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Resources Department requesting to Establish an Improvement to Blue Earth County Ditch 56, located in Section 13 of Lincoln Township to Section 18 of Garden City Township to its outlet, the Mainline open ditch for CD 56, Garden City Township (Township 107N, Range 26W), Blue Earth County, Minnesota pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 103E.215.
2. The drainage authority met on September 13, 2022, and accepted the Petition. The drainage authority also appointed Charles J. Brandel of ISG to make a Preliminary Survey Report pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 103E.245.
3. Engineer Charles J. Brandel filed a Preliminary Survey Report with the drainage authority on February 8, 2023. A copy of the Preliminary Survey Report was mailed to the Director of the Division of Ecological and Water Resources in the Department of Natural Resources on February 8, 2023.
4. The drainage authority, by order, set a public hearing for review of the engineer's Preliminary Survey Report on June 20, 2023, and directed Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Resources Department to provide at least 10 days advance notice, by mail, of the time and location of the hearing to the petitioners, political subdivisions, and owners of property likely to be affected by the proposed project.
5. Notice of the public hearing was properly provided as required by law.
6. At the public hearing, the engineer presented the Preliminary Survey Report.

7. The Commissioner's Advisory Report on the Preliminary Survey Report was publicly read and included in the record of proceedings.
8. Public comment was heard during the proceedings.
9. The proposed drainage project outlined in the petition and recommended by the engineer is feasible.
10. There is necessity for the proposed drainage project.
11. The engineer has considered the environmental, land use, and multipurpose water management criteria in Minn. Stat. § 103E.015, subd. 1. Multipurpose water management and other best management practices were included in the Preliminary Survey Report.
12. After consideration of the environmental, land use, and multipurpose water management criteria in Minn. Stat. § 103E.015, subd. 1, the drainage authority finds that the proposed drainage project is of public benefit and promotes the public health.
13. The outlet for the proposed drainage project is adequate.

Order:

Based on the foregoing Findings and the entire record of proceedings before the Board, the Blue Earth County Board, acting as the drainage authority for Blue Earth County Ditch 56, hereby orders as follows:

1. That the Preliminary Survey Report is approved.
2. The project engineer shall proceed to make a Detailed Survey Report, with plans and specifications for the proposed project consistent with the findings herein and submit a Detailed Survey Report to the drainage authority as soon as possible.
3. After the Detailed Survey Report is complete, the engineer shall file the Detailed Survey Report with the Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Resources Department. The Property and Environmental Resources Department staff shall deliver a copy of the Detailed Survey Report to the Commissioner of Natural Resources.
4. Dan Ruby, Charles W. Anderson, Lance Roberts, and Chuck Bowers as alternate, and Ron Ringquist as the alternate and consultant, shall be appointed as viewers to determine the benefits and damages to all property affected by the proposed drainage project and make a viewers' report.

- The viewers shall subscribe to an oath to faithfully perform their duties. If an appointed viewer does not qualify for any reason, the auditor shall designate another qualified person to take the disqualified viewers' place.

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The Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, Drainage Authority for Blue Earth Judicial Ditch 33 (“Drainage Authority”), at its regular meeting on June 20, 2023, having received the detailed survey report, and based on the record and proceedings, Commissioner Bruender moved, seconded by Commissioner O'Connor, for adoption of the following:

Findings:

- The Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, in its capacity as the public drainage authority under Minnesota Statutes, chapter 103E (“Drainage Authority”) is the public drainage authority for Blue Earth Judicial Ditch 33 (“JD 33”).
- A petition dated October 6, 2021, and Surety Bond in the amount of \$50,000, was received by the Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Resources Department requesting to Establish an Improvement to Blue Earth County Judicial Ditch 33 (“JD 33”), located in Sections 22, 23, 25, 26 and 27 of McPherson Township, Blue Earth County, Minnesota, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 103E.215.
- The Drainage Authority, met on December 21, 2021, and accepted the Petition. The Drainage Authority also appointed Charles J. Brandel, P.E. of ISG, Inc. and ISG, Inc. (“Project Engineers”) to make a Preliminary Survey pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 103E.245.

4. The Project Engineers filed a Preliminary Survey Report with the Drainage Authority on March 25, 2022. A copy of the Preliminary Survey Report was mailed to the Director of the Division of Ecological and Water Resources in the Department of Natural Resources on April 1, 2022.
5. The Drainage Authority, by order, set a public hearing for a review of the Project Engineers' Preliminary Survey Report on May 3, 2022, and directed the Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Resources Department to provide at least 10 days advance notice, by mail, of the time and location of the hearing to the petitioners, political subdivisions, and owners of property likely to be affected by the proposed project.
6. At the public hearing the Project Engineers presented the Preliminary Survey Report. The Commissioner's Advisory Report on the preliminary plan was publicly read and included in the record of proceedings.
7. On June 21, 2022, the Drainage Authority approved the Preliminary Survey Report and ordered the Project Engineers to make a Detailed Survey and submit a Detailed Survey Report to the Drainage Authority.
8. On March 30, 2023, the Project Engineers filed the Final Engineer's Report for JD 33 dated March 30, 2023, ("Detailed Survey Report") with the Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Services Department.
9. A copy of the Detailed Survey Report was delivered to the Commissioner of Natural Resources on April 3, 2023.
10. On May 3, 2023, Regional Environmental Assessment Ecologist for the Department of Natural Resources, Haley Byron, sent a request to the Drainage Authority for additional time to fully evaluate modeling completed by the Project Engineers for the Detailed Survey Report.
11. Floodplain Engineer, Anne Toftegaard, PE, for the Department of Natural Resources submitted a Hydrology Model Review Technical Memo to the Project Engineers and Drainage Authority staff on May 10, 2023.
12. Drainage Authority staff and Project Engineers met with representatives from the Department of Natural Resources to review the Detailed Survey Report and Technical Memo.
13. Project Engineers reported to the Drainage Authority that following the submission of the Detailed Survey Report, additional information pertaining to the project was developed and acquired in regard to the water flowing out of the JD 33 system into Blue Earth County Ditch 1. The Project Engineers reported that the model for the project must be updated with the additional information and reviewed with the Department of Natural Resources.

14. Project Engineers reported that the update to the model and additional information reviewed with the Department of Natural Resources will yield an amendment to the Detailed Survey Report.
15. The viewers' report of benefits and damages for the improvement project has not been filed with the Drainage Authority. Amendments to the Detailed Survey Report must be reviewed by the viewers before the viewers' report can be filed with the Drainage Authority. The Project Engineers anticipate preliminary benefits and damages numbers from the viewers will be obtained for inclusion in the Detailed Survey Report amendment.
16. Based upon the development of further information from the Project Engineers and upon review with the Department of Natural Resources, the Drainage Authority finds that further review of the Detailed Survey Report by Project Engineers is warranted before the Detailed Survey Report is accepted for filing with the Drainage Authority.

Based on the foregoing findings, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, sitting in its capacity as the public drainage authority for JD 33, orders as follows:

Order:

- a. That the Detailed Survey Report be returned to the Project Engineers for further review consistent with these findings.
- b. After further review of the Detailed Survey Report is complete, the Project Engineers shall file the Detailed Survey Report with amendments with the Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Services Department and the Property and Environmental Services Department shall deliver a copy of the Detailed Survey Report to the Commissioner of Natural Resources.

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At a duly noticed and public meeting, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, meeting to take action concurrently with identical action of the Waseca County Board of Commissioners and the Le Sueur County Board of Commissioners, considered appointments to the Waseca Blue Earth Le Sueur Joint County Drainage Authority Board of Commissioners for Waseca Blue Earth Joint Ditch 11. After consideration of the matter, Commissioner Paap moved, seconded by Commissioner O’Connor to adopt the following Resolution:

WHEREAS, the Waseca Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners is the public drainage authority under Minnesota Statutes, chapter 103E for Waseca Blue Earth Joint Ditch 11 (“JD 11”); and

WHEREAS, on December 21, 2020, the Waseca Blue Earth Joint County Drainage Authority met at a duly noticed and public meeting to discuss and adopt findings that the benefits of record for JD 11 do not reflect reasonable present-day land values and that the benefited or damaged areas have changed and ordering the initiation of a redetermination of benefits and damages; and

WHEREAS, the Waseca Blue Earth Joint County Drainage Authority appointed Mark Behrends, Robert Hansen, Dennis A. Distad, Kendall Langseth, John Thompson, and Bruce Ness as viewers to redetermine and report the benefits and damages and the benefited and damaged areas to the Joint County Drainage Authority and appointed the engineering firm of Jones, Haugh, & Smith, Inc. and Professional Engineer Steven J. Penkava as the civil engineers to assist the viewers; and

WHEREAS, the Waseca County Auditor-Treasurer convened an initial meeting of the viewers and administered a viewers’ oath as required by statute; and

WHEREAS, during their initial viewing, the viewers discovered property in Le Sueur County that, in the opinion of the viewers, is benefited by JD 11 and upon this discovery, the Waseca Blue Earth Joint County Drainage Authority Board of Commissioners recessed the proceedings in order to establish a joint county drainage authority for the redetermination of benefits and damages with members from Waseca, Blue Earth, and Le Sueur Counties; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, section 103E.235, subdivision 2, a public drainage system established or benefitting land in two or more counties requires the formation of a joint county drainage authority board consisting of five members, with at least one member from each county board of commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the Waseca Blue Earth Le Sueur Joint County Drainage Authority (“Joint County Drainage Authority”) for JD 11 must be established to serve as the public drainage authority over Le Sueur County property benefited by JD 11 and the Joint County Drainage Authority for JD 11 must include at least one member from Le Sueur County; and

WHEREAS, a vacancy in the membership of the Joint County Drainage Authority must be filled by joint action of the Waseca, Blue Earth, and Le Sueur County Boards of Commissioners;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners as follows:

1. That the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners appoint the following initial member from Blue Earth County as member for appointment to the Waseca Blue Earth Le Sueur Joint County Drainage Authority for JD 11:

2. Future vacancies on the Waseca Blue Earth Le Sueur Joint County Drainage Authority Board of Commissioners for JD 11 from Blue Earth County shall be filled by the successor Commissioner from the District indicated herein.
3. That since a majority of land benefited by JD 11 is located within Waseca County, Waseca County shall be the “majority” county under Minnesota Statutes, chapter 103E.
4. That this Resolution, upon being adopted by all counties constituting members of the Waseca Blue Earth Le Sueur Joint County Drainage Authority for JD 11, constitutes the joint meeting directed under Minnesota Statutes, section 103E.235, subdivision 2, and that said Resolution by the Waseca County Board of Commissioners and the Le Sueur County Board of Commissioners is cross-ratified by this Board for the formation of the Waseca

Blue Earth Le Sueur Joint County Drainage Authority Waseca Blue Earth Le Sueur Joint Ditch 11 and for fulfilling all future vacancies by and through the process described herein.

5. That the Waseca Blue Earth Le Sueur Joint County Drainage Authority for JD 11 established herein shall be perpetual until either dissolved or modified by future action of the Waseca, Blue Earth, and Le Sueur County Boards of Commissioners, seated jointly or through joint action.

HUMAN SERVICES

Mr. Phil Claussen, Human Services Director, presented the following items to the Board:

Commissioner Bruender moved and Commissioner O'Connor seconded the motion to approve the following:

Nicollet County Psychiatric Services Agreement. The purpose of this contract is to formally renew our agreement with Nicollet County to provide psychiatric services to the Seriously Mentally Ill residents of Nicollet County. This agreement allows us to provide psychiatric medication management, diagnostic assessments, psychiatric urgent care, and psychiatric consult to Nicollet County residents. The rate remains the same as in previous years. Blue Earth County will receive \$6,250.00 per quarter for a total of \$25,000.00 per year. The term of this agreement is from January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2023.

Fraud Prevention Investigation (FPI). The purpose of this contract is to secure funding that is available for the Fraud Prevention Investigation Program. This allows us to receive Department of Human Services funding to investigate welfare fraud in Blue Earth County. This is a renewal. The annual FPI Grant remains at the same amount of \$110,000.00. The term of the contract is July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2025.

Partners for Housing – Employer of Record. The purpose of this agreement is to allow Blue Earth County to continue to purchase services from Partners for Housing to act as the Employer of Record for grant-funded positions under the Community Living Infrastructure Agreement (CLI). The Housing Resource Specialist is funded through the CLI Grant. This position is responsible for working collaboratively with regionally participating counties (Rice, Le Sueur, Nicollet, and Blue Earth) with the focus on housing-related tasks, projects, and resource development. This is a renewal agreement that corresponds with a grant extension. The amount of this new agreement is \$126,000.00, which fully funds this staffing position. The term of the agreement is July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2025.

Semi-Independent Living Services (SILS). The purpose of these contracts is for the listed providers to engage Blue Earth County in order to provide Semi-Independent Living Services. These contracts allows Blue Earth County to meet the service needs of eligible County residents with a disability. These services help consumers remain living in their own homes. Semi-Independent Living Skills is considered a "non-waivered" service. The rates of these two-year contracts will increase by two percent (2%) in both 2023 and 2024 (\$39.80/\$40.60 respectively). These costs for this service is lower than the waiver rate for the same service. The term of these contracts is from July 1, 2023, through May 30, 2025. The participating providers are as follows:
