WHEREAS, Andrew Walser, owner of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, to wit:

That part of the Northeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of said Section 26, Township 107 North, Range 26 West, described as follows:

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. That the proposed use conforms with the county land use plan.
2. The demonstrated need for the proposed use.
3. That the proposed use will not degrade the water quality of the county.
4. That the proposed use will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
5. That soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the proposed use.
6. That the proposed use does not create a potential pollution hazard.
7. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or are being provided.
8. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide sufficient off-street parking and loading space to serve the proposed use.

NA15. That the intensity of the proposed residential development is not greater than the intensity allowed in the Agricultural Zoning District. 1. Must install new septic system to the home or the old septic system must be abandoned by 1/26/2014.
2. The business shall be conducted entirely within the accessory building, and six employees are allowed other than the owner.
3. Junkyards and scrapyards are prohibited.
4. Allowable signage shall be limited to a 32 square foot sign, non-illuminated, and located on the property.
5. There shall be no indication of offensive noise, vibration, smoke, dust, odors, heat or glare at or beyond the property line.
6. Materials and equipment shall be stored in an enclosed building or on the south side of the building out of public view from the road.
7. In case of the use of a commercial truck, tractor, van, pickup or any vehicle whatsoever required to be registered as a Y type vehicle or any trailer or other machinery capable of being trailed behind, such vehicle shall be parked off-street and upon the lot of the owner from where such home occupation is conducted. Parking is allowed only on a hard surfaced or gravel parking area. All drives accessing a hard-surfaced road shall be bituminous or concrete.
