10. A bond or other financial assurance acceptable to the County must be established prior to the issuance of a Construction Permit and must be kept in place to ensure removal of all

concrete footings, foundations and supporting equipment to a depth of 4 feet below the ground surface in the event that the tower is abandoned. Abandoned or unused facilities shall be removed within twelve months of the conclusion of operations at the site.

11. The communications tower shall be designed, structurally, electrically and in all respects, to accommodate the applicant's antenna and comparable antennae from at least three additional users. All utility costs, and costs connected with installation and maintenance of County equipment shall be borne by the County.

The County will provide appropriate proof of insurance and / or release of liability to the tower owner. Such insurance / release of liability shall apply equally to equipment owned or controlled by the County and / or actions taken by County employees and / or agent(s).

Said construction report shall be signed by a professional engineer registered in the State of Minnesota and will include the following: photographic documentation of reinforcing steel placement, collection of three sample concrete cylinders to be retained by the engineer / landowner for concrete compressive strength testing, and three batch tickets documenting the concrete design.
13. That the applicant comply with the storm-water control requirements established by the MPCA.
14. That if one acre of land or more is disturbed during the construction process, the applicant must follow Best Management Practices (BMPs) for storm-water control as established by the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency.

This resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage and without publication.

JOBZ PUBLIC HEARING

**BLUE EARTH COUNTY RESOLUTION
APPROVING JOB OPPORTUNITY BUILDING ZONE (JOBZ) TAX EXEMPTIONS
FOR EROSION TECHNOLOGIES, INC. PROJECT**

WHEREAS, Blue Earth County, Minnesota (the "County"), as part of the Positively Southern Minnesota Corridor Job Zone, has received designation as a Job Opportunity Building Zone (JOBZ) Subzone (the "Subzone") from the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to M.S. § 116J.993 - 116J.995 (the "Business Subsidy Statute") the County has agreed to provide all tax exemptions listed in M.S. § 469.315 to every qualified business, individual that invests in a qualified business, and property located in the Subzone during the Subzone term; and

WHEREAS, the County has received a proposal to grant JOBZ Business Subsidies from Erosion Technologies, Inc. (the "Qualified Business") within the Subzone under the provisions of the Business Subsidy Statute; and

WHEREAS, the County has drafted a Subsidy Agreement under the provisions of the Business Subsidy Statute; and

WHEREAS, the County has received and considered the comments of the City of Mapleton with regard to the JOBZ Business Subsidies for the Qualified Business; and

WHEREAS, the County on April 25, 2006, after having published notice of public hearing in the official newspaper, conducted a public hearing on the JOBZ Business Subsidies and received public comments on the same; now therefore

THE BLUE EARTH COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS RESOLVES:

Sec. 1. That the Qualified Business will locate within the Subzone on property with tax identification number R.15.24.03.351.010 which is comprised of land with a vacant building thereon.

Sec. 2. That the Qualified Business is approved by the County to be a new business start-up within in the Subzone.

Sec. 3. That the public purposes for the JOBZ Business Subsidy include enhancement of economic diversity, creation of high quality job growth, stabilization of the community and enhancement of the tax base.

Sec. 4. That the County Board authorizes the County Administrator to execute the Subsidy Agreement with the Qualified Business.

Sec. 5. That the Job Zone Term shall be effective upon execution of the Subsidy Agreement until December 31, 2015.

Sec. 6. That the County Administrator is hereby directed to file a copy of this resolution and the Subsidy Agreement with the Department Employment and Economic Development and the Blue Earth County Assessor.

WHEREAS, job creation, business development, and individual wealth growth in Blue Earth County (the "County"), have been less than the national and state averages; and

WHEREAS, the resulting affects of such lagging job creation, business development, and individual wealth growth have harmed and are forecasted to continue to harm the economy of the County; and

WHEREAS, the Job Opportunity Building Zone (the "JOBZ") Program created in Minnesota Session Laws 2003, 1st Special Session, Chapter 21, Article 1 allows for the formation of tax free zones; and

WHEREAS, an application for tax free zone designation in the County was submitted to the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development via the City of Fairmont, Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, the County finds it is necessary to modify the "Blue Earth County JOBZ Sub Zones Application" previously submitted to the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development via the City of Fairmont, Minnesota; therefore,

THE BLUE EARTH COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS RESOLVES:

Sec. 1. That the County Board of Commissioners, at its meeting held on April 25, 2006, upon careful consideration and review, approves the request to modify the Blue Earth County JOBZ Sub Zones Application as per amended application materials dated April 12, 2006 for tax free zones, approves of the use of tax exemptions and tax credits within the designated zones (subject to proper review and approval by the other appropriate taxing authorities within the zones), and encourages the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development to approve the request to modify the Blue Earth County JOBZ Sub Zones Application.

Sec. 2. That the County agrees to provide all of the local tax exemptions and credits required and provided for under the JOBZ's Legislation and agrees to forego the tax benefits resulting from the local and state tax exemptions and credits provided under the JOBZ's Legislation.

TAX ABATEMENT PUBLIC HEARING

Mr. Ed Tschida, Advanced Resources, presented information to the Board regarding the Tax Abatement Financing for the City of Lake Crystal.

Chairperson Wortel opened the public comment portion of the hearing. There being no comments, the public comment portion of the hearing was closed.

Commissioner Roberts moved and Commissioner McLaughlin seconded the motion to approve the following resolution:

RESOLUTION OF BLUE EARTH COUNTY

**APPROVING PROPERTY TAX ABATEMENTS FOR THE
HARDWARE STORE REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT**

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board (the “Board”) of Blue Earth County (the “County”), as follows:

1. Recitals.

(a) The County has determined to assist the Hardware Store Redevelopment Project located in the City of Lake Crystal (the "Project") in order to increase or preserve the tax base of the County, redevelop property, help expand commercial enterprise in the County and provide employment opportunities.

(b) It has been proposed that the Project be funded, in part, through abatement of the County’s share of property taxes resulting from the increased market value of the property. The identification of the specific parcel (the "Property"), the duration and annual amount of the Abatement is stipulated as follows:

Parcel Number	Use	Maximum Duration of Abatement	Estimated Abatement Proceeds Per Year
R.09.12.05.213.002	Commercial	Jan. 1, 2008 - Dec. 31, 2022 inclusive	\$1,764

(c) Currently, the abatement ("the Abatement") is estimated at \$1,764 per year and at \$25,776 over the fifteen-year period.

(d) The County will transfer to the City of Lake Crystal the Abatement to reimburse Project costs. Upon reimbursement of these costs the County will terminate the Abatement program.

(e) On the date hereof, the Board held a public hearing on the question of the Abatement, and said hearing was preceded by at least 10 days but not more than 30 days prior published notice hereof.

(f) The Abatement is authorized under Minnesota Statutes, Sections 469.1812 through 469.1815 (the "Abatement Law").

2. Findings for the Abatement. The County Board hereby makes the following findings:

(a) The Board expects the benefits to the County of the Abatement to at least equal the costs thereof; and

(b) Granting the Abatement is in the public interest because it will increase or preserve the tax base of the County, redevelop property, help expand commercial enterprise in the County and provide employment opportunities; and

(c) The Board expects the public benefits described in 2(b) above to be derived from the Abatement.

3. **Terms of Abatement.** The abatement is hereby approved. The terms of the abatement are as follows:

(a) The Abatement shall be for a maximum term of fifteen years. The Abatement shall apply to the taxes payable in the years 2008 through 2022, inclusive.

(b) The Abatement shall be for 100% of County property tax on market value in excess of \$25,300 (the market value established by Blue Earth County for taxes payable in 2006) of the property subject to abatement; furthermore, the total amount of the County share of property tax to be abated shall not exceed \$25,776 during the term of the Abatement.

(c) The County will transfer to the City of Lake Crystal the Abatement to reimburse Project costs.

(d) The Abatement may not be modified or changed during the term set forth in 3(a) above without the prior written consent of the Board.

(e) The Abatement shall be subject to all the terms and limitations of the Abatement Law.

(f) The County authorizes the City of Lake Crystal to act as its agent and to execute a development agreement relating to construction of the Project to be located on Parcel R.09.12.05.213.002, as that proposed development is the basis for generation of the County's share of the Abatement.

(g) For the term of the Abatement, the Property will not be located in a tax increment financing district.

(h) In any year, the total amount of property taxes abated by the County by this and other resolutions does not exceed the greater of ten percent (10%) of the current levy or \$200,000.

Eliminating Health Disparities. A grant agreement with the Minnesota Department of Health in the amount of \$1,547.00 to provide services to refugees and foreign-born individuals in order to reduce health disparities in those populations.

Local Public Health Act. Assurances and agreements that the 2006 Local Public Health Act funding will be used in accordance with the terms outlined in the Community Health Board Master Contract.

UCare. An amendment to the UCare Provider Agreement allowing reimbursement for services provided by Blue Earth County Human Services to MinnesotaCare-eligible recipients.

Cirdan Health Systems and Consulting. An agreement with Cirdan Health Systems and Consulting for the provision of health care consulting services to analyze enrollment, revenue, and expense projections related to determining the feasibility of a county-based purchasing project.

South Country Health Alliance. Authorization for the Board chair to sign a letter to South Country Health Alliance expressing the County's intent to enter into a planning process with South Country Health Alliance.
