**WHEREAS**, On National POW/MIA Recognition Day, we reaffirm our commitment to those still missing by flying the flag of the National League of Families of American Prisoners of War and Missing in Southeast Asia. This black and white banner which symbolizes America's missing, is a powerful reminder to people around the world that our Nation will keep the faith with those who have served and sacrificed.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED THAT** The Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners does hereby proclaim September 15, 2006 as POW/MIA Recognition

## **PLANNING AND ZONING**

Mr. Veryl Morrell, Land Use Administrator, and Mr. Scott Salsbury, Land Use/Natural Resource Planner, presented the following items to the Board.

Commissioner McLaughlin moved and Commissioner Landkamer seconded the motion to approve the following resolution:

**RESOLUTION GRANTING AN REQUEST FOR AN EXTENSION OF CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT NUMBER PC 25-01 TO CONTINUE GRAVEL MINING OPERATIONS AND TO ALLOW FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND OPERATION OF A TEMPORARY BITUMINOUS HOT MIX PLANT. THE SITE IS LOCATED IN THE AGRICULTURAL ZONED DISTRICT IN THE EAST HALF OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE NORTHEAST 1/4, SECTION 21, CAMBRIA TOWNSHIP.**

**WHEREAS**, Mervin Jones, owner of the gravel mining operation in the County of Blue Earth to wit:

The Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter and the Northeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 21, Cambria Township, T109N R29W, Blue Earth County, Minnesota

Is requesting an extension of a Conditional Use Permit to continue gravel mining activities and to allow for the construction and operation of a temporary bituminous hot mix plant in a previously permitted gravel mine: and,

**WHEREAS**, the planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 22-06), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and,

**WHEREAS**, the requested use does not conflict with the Land Use Plan, Gravel Mining Operations are a Conditional Use in the Agricultural Zoned District; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:



1. That the continued use conforms with the Land Use Plan.
2. That with proper management, the continued use will not degrade the water quality of the County.
3. That with proper management, the continued use will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
4. That soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the continued use.
5. That continuation of the conditional use does not create a potential pollution hazard.
6. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been provided.
7. That continuation of the Conditional Use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
8. That continuation of the established Conditional Use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for the predominant uses in the area.
9. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to prevent or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise, and vibration, so that none of these will constitute a nuisance, and to control lighted signs and other lights in such a manner that no disturbance to neighboring properties will result.
10. The intensity of the continued use is not greater than the intensity of the surrounding land uses.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request for a Conditional Use Permit is hereby granted based on the following conditions:

1. Operations shall be conducted in compliance with the laws of the State of Minnesota, the Federal Government, and ordinances and resolutions of Blue Earth County, as amended from time to time. If required by the MPCA, an NPDES Permit shall be obtained prior to commencement of the particular operations that triggered the requirement.

2. All reclamation activities shall be conducted in compliance with the approved reclamation plan.
3. Ingress and egress points from or onto any roadway shall be clearly signed, and only those signed access points shall be utilized. All access points must be approved by the Highway Agency having jurisdiction.
4. Trucks used in hauling materials from the site of excavation shall be loaded in such a manner as to minimize spillage onto public roadways. Any spillage resulting from overloading or from truck tires shall be removed at regular intervals.
5. Upon completion of operations, all buildings, plants, and equipment shall be removed within six (6) months, unless such buildings, plants, and equipment will be used in the reclamation process.
6. Operating procedures will be utilized to control dust and noise so as not to be in conflict with adjoining property.
7. A Department of Natural Resources Water Appropriations Permit shall be obtained if required by the DNR.
8. Hours of operation shall be as agreed upon between the applicant and the Township. However, operating hours may not exceed 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday. A one hour quiet time "warm up period" beginning at 6:00 a.m. is allowed for the bituminous plant only.
9. A performance bond or its equivalent must be provided and maintained in the amount of \$10,000 payable to Blue Earth County to ensure that clean-up and reclamation activities take place as listed in the staff report. Said financial assurance must be provided to Blue Earth County.
10. The Conditional Use Permit shall be effective for a period of five years following County Board approval, until August 29, 2011. The applicants shall make application for review of the permit prior to July 1, 2011.

This Conditional Use Permit shall become effective immediately upon its passage and without publication.

The North Half of the Southwest Quarter of Section 16, Decoria Township, T 107 N R 26 W.

And Terry Bangert have applied for a Conditional Use Permit to Transfer a Residential Development Right **from** the Northwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter **to** the Northeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 16, Decoria Township for the purpose of having two building sites in a quarter-quarter section.

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 28-06 ), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Commission of the County on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of August, 2006, following proper notice, held a public hearing regarding the request and, following the hearing, adopted a recommendation that the request for a Conditional Use Permit be granted; and

**WHEREAS**, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. That the Transfer of Development Rights conforms with the County Land Use Plan.
2. That the Transfer of Development Rights will not degrade the water quality of the County.
3. That the Transfer of Development Rights will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
4. That soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the Transfer of Development Rights.
5. That the Transfer of Development Rights does not create a potential pollution hazard.

6. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or are being provided.
7. That the Transfer of Development Rights will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
8. That the establishment of the Transfer of Development Rights will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for predominant uses in the area.
9. That site specific conditions and such other conditions are established as required for the protection of the public's health, safety, morals, and general welfare.
10. That the intensity of the proposed residential development is not greater than the intensity allowed in the Agricultural Zoning District.
11. Sec. 24-111 of the Agricultural District States : "Owners of property, residents, other users of property in the agricultural zone, and neighboring properties adjacent to the agricultural zone may be subjected to inconvenience or discomfort arising from normal and accepted agricultural practices and operations including, but not limited to; noise, odors, dust, operation of aircraft and late night operation of farm machinery, the storage and application of manure, fertilizers, soil amendments, herbicides, and pesticides associated with normal agricultural operations.

Owners of Property, residents, other users of property in the agricultural zone, and neighboring properties to the agricultural zone, should be prepared to accept such inconveniences or discomfort from normal operations, and are hereby put on official notice, pursuant to MN Statutes, Chapter 561.19, that this declaration may prevent them from obtaining a legal judgment against such normal operations."

12. That the applicants have made significant progress in bringing the property in compliance with the County Code by removing many vehicles and scrap metal. However, the property would still be classified as a junk yard and environmental hazard by the County Code.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the Conditional Use Permit to Transfer a Residential Development Right **from** the Northwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter **to** the Northeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 16, Decoria Township for the purpose of having two building sites in a quarter-quarter section is granted with the following conditions:

1. That the applicants divide the property in accordance with the provisions of the County Code.
2. That within six months of occupying the proposed dwelling, the existing environmental hazards must be properly abated.

THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF NORTHEAST QUARTER SECTION 24, VERNON  
CENTER TOWNSHIP**

**WHEREAS**, Roelofs Farms Inc., owner of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, to wit:

Commencing at the Northwest corner of the Northeast Quarter of Section 24, Township 106, Range 28, Blue Earth County, Minnesota; thence South on the North-South quarter section line a distance of 104 feet to the point of beginning; thence East a distance of 612 feet parallel to the East-West section line; thence South a distance of 724 feet parallel to the North-South quarter section line; thence West a distance of 612 feet parallel to the East-West section line to a point on the North-South quarter section line; thence North on the North-South quarter section line a distance of 724 feet to the point of beginning.

has applied for a Conditional Use Permit to construct one total confinement swine barn expanding an existing feedlot in an C, Conservation Zoning District; and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC29-06), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Commission of the County on the 2nd day of August, 2006, following proper notice, held a public hearing regarding the request and, following the hearing, adopted a recommendation that the request for a Conditional Use Permit be granted; and

**WHEREAS**, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds that:

1. That with proper management of the proposed barn and with proper manure application, the Conditional Use should not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity designated for agricultural uses.
2. That with proper management of the proposed barn and with proper manure application, this facility should not constitute a pollution problem.
3. That the predominant use in the area is agriculture. The Conditional Use should not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for agricultural uses.
4. Adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or will be provided.
5. Adequate measures will be taken to provide sufficient off-road parking and loading space to serve the proposed use.
6. Soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the proposed request.
7. Proper facilities will be provided which will eliminate any traffic congestion or traffic hazard which may result from the proposed use.
8. The feedlot is not greater than the feedlot standards allowed in the A, Agricultural Zoning District.
9. The proposed use is consistent with the County Land Use Plan.
10. That the proposed use does not include residential development.
11. That the proposed use does not include industrial development.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request for a Conditional Use Permit, to build one total confinement swine barn in an Conservation Zoning District, is granted with the following conditions:

1. That the total confinement barn, conforms with the site plan attached to this report (PC 29-06).
2. That the feedlot, including all buildings and the proposed barn, be located on a single, legally described parcel consisting of a minimum of ten contiguous acres. The parcel

shall be a parcel of record, properly recorded in the Blue Earth County Land Records Office.

3. That the applicant must obtain an updated Blue Earth County Feedlot Permit before any animals are placed in the barn.
4. That the applicant obtain a Blue Earth County Construction Permit before building begins and within one year from the date the County Board of Commissioners approves the Conditional Use Permit. The permit shall be rendered invalid if application for a Construction Permit is not made within this one year period. Time extensions for Conditional Use Permits must be obtained from the County Board of Commissioners subsequent to a public hearing conducted by the Planning Commission.
5. If required by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, that the applicant obtain a Department of the Natural Resources, "Water Appropriations Permit" before any animals are placed in the proposed barn.
6. That a perimeter footing drain tile be located at or below the bottom of the pit footings. The footing tile shall include one inspection pipe for each concrete pit. The native materials must be excavated and walls back filled with granular material (pit run gravel or equivalent). *Exceptions to this may only include specific design standards submitted by the design engineer of the manure storage structure.*
7. That application of the manure be on land documented in the aerial photos included in the State of Minnesota Application for Construction and Operation of an animal feedlot. The application of manure shall comply with standards set forth by the MPCA. A manure management plan meeting MPCA requirements must be submitted for review prior to stocking the new barns. This plan must be reviewed by the operator each year and adjusted for any changes in the amount of manure production, manure nutrient test results, fields available for receiving manure, crop rotations, or other practices which affect the available nutrients amounts or crop nutrient needs on fields receiving manure as required by the MPCA. Manure application setback standards for the fields on which the manure is applied shall be followed as provided in attachment A-7.
8. That the disposal of dead animals be consistent with the Minnesota Board of Animal Health regulations.
9. If rendering is the method of choice for mortality disposal, the applicant shall provide an enclosed location for the pick up of dead animals before any animals are placed in the proposed barn.
10. That adequate measures be taken to minimize or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise, or vibrations so that none of these will constitute a nuisance.

11. That all manure storage structures must be designed by a registered engineer. A copy of the designed plans must be submitted to Blue Earth County Environmental Services prior to the issuance of a construction permit.
12. That the applicant will furnish a final construction report to Environmental Services verifying that the concrete manure storage structure was constructed per approved engineered design plan. Said construction report shall be signed by a professional engineer registered in the State of Minnesota and will include the following: photographic documentation of reinforcing steel placement, collection of three sample concrete cylinders to be retained by the engineer / landowner for concrete compressive strength testing, and three batch tickets documenting the concrete design.
13. That the applicant comply with the storm-water control requirements established by the MPCA.
14. That if a shower, restrooms or laundry facility is included with the proposed barn or any other livestock barns on the site, that a waste water treatment system is reviewed and constructed according to County Environmental Health Department standards.

8. Adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide sufficient off-road parking space to serve the proposed use.
9. The Conditional Use should not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
10. The Conditional Use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for the predominate uses in the area.
11. That site specific and such other conditions are established to protect the public's health, safety and general welfare.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the Conditional Use Permit is hereby **granted** contingent upon the following:

1. All grading/filling, and construction activities shall be conducted in accordance with approved plans attached to this staff report.
2. Erosion control measures must be employed to ensure that silt and solids are not carried from the site. Said measures must be maintained until vegetation has been adequately established to protect the site from the erosive forces of nature.
3. All of the County Engineer's requirements referenced in PC 31-06 shall be complied with.
4. Construction permits shall be obtained prior to the commencement of construction.

has applied for a Conditional Use Permit to construct two total confinement swine barns at an existing feedlot in an A, Agriculture Zoning District; and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC27-06), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Commission of the County on the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of August, 2006, following proper notice, held a public hearing regarding the request and, following the hearing, adopted a recommendation that the request for a Conditional Use Permit be approved; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED;** by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request to construct two total confinement swine barns at an existing feedlot located in the A- Agricultural Zoned District is hereby:

**Granted** with the following conditions:

**Denied** (and the following conditions are inapplicable):

1. That the total confinement barns, conform to the site plan attached to this report (PC 27-06).
2. That the proposed barns be located on a single, legally described parcel consisting of a minimum of ten contiguous acres or combined with the home site to create a single, legally described parcel consisting of a minimum of ten contiguous acres. The parcel shall be a parcel of record, properly recorded in the Blue Earth County Land Records Office.
3. That the applicant must obtain an updated Blue Earth County Feedlot Permit before any animals are placed in the new barn.

4. That the applicant obtain a Blue Earth County Construction Permit before building begins and within one year from the date the County Board of Commissioners approves the Conditional Use Permit. The permit shall be rendered invalid if application for a Construction Permit is not made within this one year period. Time extensions for Conditional Use Permits must be obtained from the County Board of Commissioners subsequent to a public hearing conducted by the Planning Commission.
5. If required by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, that the applicant obtain a Department of Natural Resources, "Water Appropriations Permit" before any animals are placed in the proposed barn.
6. That a perimeter footing drain tile be located at or below the bottom of the pit footings. The footing tile shall include one inspection pipe for each concrete pit. The native materials must be excavated and walls back filled with granular material (pit run gravel or equivalent). *Exceptions to this may only include specific design standards submitted by the design engineer of the manure storage structure.*
7. That application of manure be on the land documented in the aerial photos included in the State of Minnesota Application for Construction and Operation of an animal feedlot. The application of manure shall comply with standards set forth by the MPCA. A manure management plan meeting MPCA requirements must be submitted for review prior to stocking the new barn. This plan must be reviewed by the operator each year and adjusted for any changes in the amount of manure production, manure nutrient test results, fields available for receiving manure, crop rotations, or other practices which affect the available nutrient amounts or crop nutrient needs on fields receiving manure as required by the MPCA. Records of manure application shall be maintained as required by the MPCA. Manure application setback standards for the fields on which the manure is applied shall be followed as required by the MPCA and the County.
8. That the disposal of dead animals be consistent with the Minnesota Board of Animal Health regulations.
9. If rendering is the method of choice for mortality disposal, the applicant shall provide an enclosed location for the pick up of dead animals before any animals are placed in the proposed barn.
10. That adequate measures be taken to minimize or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise, or vibrations so that none of these will constitute a nuisance.
11. That all manure storage structures must be designed by a registered engineer. A copy of the designed plans must be submitted to Blue Earth County Environmental Services prior to the issuance of a construction permit.



12. That the applicant will furnish a final construction report to Environmental Services verifying that the concrete manure storage structure was constructed per approved engineered design plan. Said construction report shall be signed by a professional engineer registered in the State of Minnesota and will include the following: photographic documentation of reinforcing steel placement, collection of three sample concrete cylinders to be retained by the engineer / landowner for concrete compressive strength testing, and three batch tickets documenting the concrete design.
13. That the applicant comply with the storm-water control requirements established by the MPCA.
14. That all exposed earthen surfaces be seeded into grass or utilized as crop acreage.
15. That plans for water supply line (if provided from an off-site location and crossing the Township Road) be reviewed and approved by the Township Board.
16. That a turnaround area be provided by the applicant on site as requested by the Township Board.

This resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage and without publication.
