AMENDED AGENDA

COMMITTEE REPORTS

SMALL CITIES REVOLVING LOANS

Ms. Patty Woodruff, City of Mapleton, Ms. Tammy Schmidt, Hair Designers and Tannery, and Mr. Tony Gregor, Token BBQ, presented information on the following loans.

PLANNING AND ZONING

Mr. Veryl Morrell, Land Use Administrator and Mr. George Leary, Land Use/Natural Resource Specialist, presented the following items to the Board.

Commissioner Purvis moved and Commissioner Bruender seconded the motion to approve the following resolution:

**RESOLUTION GRANTING A REQUEST FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME FOR
CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT PC 06-01 WHICH AUTHORIZED THE
CONTINUATION OF A GRAVEL MINING OPERATION AND OCCASIONAL
OPERATION OF A TEMPORARY BITUMINOUS HOT MIX PLANT IN THE NE ¼ OF
THE NE ¼ OF SECTION 13, GARDEN CITY TOWNSHIP AND THE NORTH HALF
OF THE NW ¼ OF SECTION 18, RAPIDAN TOWNSHIP. THE AREA IS LOCATED IN
THE CONSERVATION, AGRICULTURAL AND SHORELAND ZONED DISTRICTS.**

WHEREAS, Donald Friedrichs, owner of the property in the County of Blue Earth to wit:

The North Half of the Northwest Quarter in Section 18 of Rapidan Township said tract containing 74.80 acres, and

the Northeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter except the Power Company's 14.05 acres in Section 13 of Garden City Township said tract containing 25.90 acres.

Is requesting authorization to continue aggregate mining and processing operations and,

WHEREAS, the planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 23-08), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and,

WHEREAS, the requested use does not conflict with the Land Use Plan, Gravel Mining Operations are a Conditional Use in the Agricultural, Conservation and Shoreland Zoned Districts; and,

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. That continuation of the use conforms to the Land Use Plan.
2. That with proper management, the use will not degrade the water quality of the County.
3. That with proper management, the use will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
4. That soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the use.
5. That the continued use does not create a potential pollution hazard.
6. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been provided.
7. That the Conditional Use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
8. That continuation of the Conditional Use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for the predominant uses in the area.
9. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to prevent or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise, and vibration, so that none of these will constitute a nuisance, and to control lighted signs and other lights in such a manner that no disturbance to neighboring properties will result.
10. The intensity of the use is not greater than the intensity of the surrounding land uses.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request for a Conditional Use Permit is hereby granted based on the following conditions:

1. The mining operations shall be conducted in compliance with the laws of the State of Minnesota, the Federal Government, and the Blue Earth County Zoning Ordinance, Article 7, Mineral Extraction
2. The applicant shall obtain and maintain all air emissions and water quality permits as required by MPCA.
3. Hours of operation shall be limited to 7:00 AM through 9:00 PM to prevent disturbing noise during normal sleeping hours. A quiet-time warm-up period may commence at 6:00 AM for the bituminous plant only.
4. Access points from and onto any road or highway shall be clearly indicated, and only those access points shall be utilized. All access points must be approved by the appropriate jurisdictional agency.
5. Trucks used in hauling materials from the site of excavation shall be loaded in such a manner as to minimize spillage onto public roadways. Precautions must be taken to minimize the deposit of dirt and mined materials onto public roads or highways. Any spillage resulting from overloading or from adhering to truck tires shall be removed at regular intervals.
6. The amount of overburden to be removed shall not be in excess of that required to undertake operations in an economical manner. Development toward the final reclamation plan shall be carried on as excavation progresses.
7. Proposed back slopes, graded or back filled areas, or banks shall be covered with sufficient topsoil to provide for re-vegetation. Where ground cover or other planting is indicated on an approved plan, such planting shall be made in areas where excavation is completed and land is not being used for material storage, and shall be as recommended by the SWCD.
8. Upon completion of excavation, all buildings, plants, and equipment, shall be removed within six (6) months, unless such buildings, plants, and equipment will be used in the reclamation process.
9. Operating procedures will be utilized to control dust and noise so as not to be in conflict with adjoining property owners.
10. Mining operations shall not be conducted closer than fifty (50) feet to the boundary of an adjoining property line, unless the written consent of the adjoining property owner is first secured.
11. Excavating or stockpiling shall not be conducted closer than one hundred (100) feet to the right-of-way line of any existing or platted street, road, or highway, where such excavation may create a traffic or line of site problem.
12. A Reclamation Performance Bond or Letter of Credit for \$1,000 per acre shall be presented to the County and maintained until closure to guarantee that either upon termination of the permit or the operations, the ground surface of the land used shall be restored in conformity with the reclamation plan filed with the mining permit application.

13. Violations of any of the above conditions may lead to a review of this conditional use permit by the County Board. Actions taken by the Board may be civil or criminal in nature and may include suspension or revocation of this permit.
14. This permit shall be effective for a period of five years, until May 27, 2013, after which it will be reviewed by the Blue Earth County Board. Board action may include continuation, modification, or revocation with cause.

This Conditional Use Permit shall become effective immediately upon its passage and without publication.

**RESOLUTION GRANTING A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT AUTHORIZING THE
CONSTRUCTION AND OPERATION OF A 185 FOOT TALL UN-LIGHTED GUYED
CELLULAR COMMUNICATIONS TOWER IN THE A, AGRICULTURE ZONED DISTRICT
IN THE NW 1/4 OF THE SW 1/4 OF SECTION 23,
JAMESTOWN TOWNSHIP**

WHEREAS, James and Mary Fasnacht, owners of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth to wit:

The West one hundred (100) acres of the Southwest Quarter (SW 1/4) of Section Twenty-Three (23), Township One Hundred Nine (109) North, Range Twenty-Five (25) West, Except 1.19 acres for highway right-of-way, Blue Earth County, Minnesota,

are requesting a conditional use permit allowing construction and operation of a 185 foot tall Cellular Telephone Communications Tower in the NW 1/4 of the SW 1/4, Section 23, Jamestown Township; and,

WHEREAS, the legal description of the tract that Voicestream is leasing for the tower site is as follows:

That part of the West One Hundred (100) Acres of the Southwest Quarter of Section 23, Township 109 North, Range 25 West, Blue Earth County, Minnesota, described as follows:

Commencing at the southwest corner of the Southwest Quarter of said Section 23, thence North 89 degrees 57 minutes 03 seconds East (bearings based on the Blue Earth County Coordinate Grid), along the South line of said Southwest Quarter a distance of 320.78 feet; thence on a bearing of North a distance of 1886.54 feet to the point of beginning of the lease tract to be described; thence continuing on a bearing of North a distance of 140.00 feet; thence on a bearing of West a distance of 55.00 feet; thence on a bearing of North a distance of 91.55 feet; thence North 60 degrees 00 minutes 00 seconds West a distance of 136.28 feet; thence North 30 degrees 00 minutes 00 seconds East a distance of 70.00 feet; thence South 60 degrees 00 minutes 00 seconds East a distance of 120.62 feet; thence on a bearing of East a distance of 137.13 feet; thence North 60 degrees 00 minutes 00 seconds East a distance of 120.62 feet; thence South 30 degrees 00 minutes 00 seconds East a distance of 70.00 feet; thence South 60 degrees 00 minutes 00 seconds West a distance of 136.28 feet; thence on a bearing of South a distance of 91.55 feet; thence on a bearing of West a distance of 55.00 feet; thence on a bearing of South a distance of

140.00 feet; thence on a bearing of East a distance of 70.00 feet to the point of beginning.

The area of the proposed lease tract is 1.27 Acres; and,

WHEREAS, The legal description of the proposed access easement is as follows: A 20.00 foot wide easement for ingress and egress purposes over, under and across that part of the West One Hundred (100) acres of the Southwest Quarter of Section 23, Township 109 North, Range 25 West, Blue Earth County, Minnesota, the center line of said easement being described as follows:

Commencing at the southwest corner of the Southwest Quarter of Section 23, thence North 89 degrees 57 minutes 03 seconds East (bearings based on the Blue Earth County Coordinate Grid), along the south line of said Southwest Quarter a distance of 320.78 feet; thence on a bearing of North a distance of 1886.54 feet; thence continuing on a bearing of North a distance of 140.00 feet; thence on a bearing of West a distance of 38.94 feet to the point of beginning of the center line to be described; thence South 16 degrees 17 minutes 19 seconds East a distance of 100.32 feet; thence South 00 degrees 31 minutes 29 seconds East a distance of 80.00 feet; thence South 76 degrees 09 minutes 56 seconds West a distance of 33.07 feet; thence North 49 degrees 45 minutes 03 seconds West a distance of 59.76 feet; thence North 84 degrees 46 minutes 01 seconds West a distance of 117.31 feet; thence North 89 degrees 33 minutes 25 seconds West a distance of 60.92 feet to the easterly right-of-way line of Blue Earth County Road Number 26, and said center line there terminating.

The area of the proposed access easement contains 9,028 square feet; and,

WHEREAS, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 15-08), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and,

WHEREAS; the request to approve the Cell Tower does not conflict with the Land Use Plan; and,

WHEREAS; the Planning Commission of the County on the 7th Day of May, 2008, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to forward the matter to the County Board with a recommendation for approval subject to conditions contained in staff report No. PC 15-08, and,

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. The telecommunications tower does not conflict with the County Land Use Plan.
2. The telecommunications tower will not degrade the water quality of the County.
3. The telecommunications tower will not adversely increase the quantity of water run-off.
4. That the soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the telecommunications tower.
5. The telecommunications tower does not create a potential pollution hazard.
6. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or are being provided for operation of the telecommunications tower.

7. Adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide sufficient off-street parking and loading space to serve the telecommunications tower.
8. The telecommunications tower will not result in traffic congestion or traffic hazards.
9. The telecommunications tower will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
10. The establishment of the telecommunications tower will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for the predominant uses in the area.
11. Adequate measures will be taken to prevent or control lighted signs and other lights in such a manner that no disturbance to neighbors will result.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request for approval of the Cell Tower is hereby **granted** contingent upon the following:

1. The tower shall be set back from the roadway and property lines as per attached site plan.
2. Accessory building(s) may be allowed for each co-location user of the facility. Each building shall house only electronic equipment and environmental control equipment that is necessary for the functioning of the broadcasting/telecommunications tower. The building shall be painted and maintained as a single, neutral color.
3. The tower and accessory buildings shall be adequately fenced. Gates shall be locked.
4. The property owner shall ensure that the site is maintained in a weed free and nuisance free manner.
5. Signs, other than warning signs, equipment labels, or emergency information, are prohibited on any towers, antennae or accessory structure or equipment. Warning signs, equipment labels and emergency information signs must not exceed three square feet in area.
6. The broadcasting/telecommunications tower shall be a single, neutral color, unless alternative colors are required by the FAA.
7. The broadcasting/telecommunications tower shall meet all requirements of the FAA and FCC.
8. The parking surface and access drives shall be maintained with an all weather surface.
9. A bond or other financial assurance acceptable to Blue Earth County shall be established and kept in place to ensure proper removal of all concrete foundations and fittings in the event that the Tower is abandoned. Abandoned or unused towers and associated facilities shall be removed within twelve months of the cessation of operations at the site.
10. The broadcasting/telecommunications tower shall be designed, structurally, electrically and in all respects, to accommodate the applicant's antenna and comparable antennae from at least three additional users. The tower must be designed to allow for future

rearrangement of antennae upon the tower and to accept antennae mounted at varying heights.

11. Any change in operation or use of the facility shall require review of the Conditional Use Permit. The applicant shall apply for a review of the Conditional Use Permit prior to any operational or construction changes involved with the proposed use.
12. Violations of any of the above conditions may lead to a review of the Conditional Use Permit by the Planning Commission and County Board of Commissioners.
13. Applicant agrees to grant the County a first refusal right to use antennae space on the tower and equipment space within the accessory building(s). Such space to be for governmental use including, but not limited to; communications service antennae and related equipment to accommodate Cellular Telephone Service, Personal Communication Services (PCS), and Cellular Digital Packet Data (CPDA) Service, to the extent the tower can accommodate such use. If space is not available within the accessory building, the owner of the tower shall allow the County to construct additional accessory building(s) as required to house County equipment. Owner of the tower shall make the space available at the prevailing market rate.

If the County reserves space for governmental use, the County will ensure that any equipment installed by the County on the tower, or in the accessory building, will not interfere with the operation of the applicants or other tenants equipment. Correction of any interference caused by installation of County equipment shall be the County's responsibility. Interference caused by any other tenant's equipment installed after the County's equipment, shall be the responsibility of the third party.

All utility costs, and costs connected with installation and maintenance of County equipment shall be borne by the County.

The County will provide appropriate proof of insurance and / or release of liability to the tower owner. Such insurance / release of liability shall apply equally to equipment owned or controlled by the County and / or actions taken by County employees and / or agent(s).

14. Construction permits shall not be issued for the Cell Tower until the building site has been satisfactorily cleaned up.
15. The Conditional Use Permit shall be effective for a period of five years following County Board approval, until May 27, 2013, whereupon it may be reviewed by the Board.

This conditional use permit shall become effective immediately upon its passage and without publication.

Commissioner Bruender moved and Commissioner Purvis seconded the motion to approve the following resolution:

**ORDINANCE ADOPTING AND IMPLEMENTING AN OFFICIAL URBAN FRINGE
OVERLAY DISTRICT (UFD) MAP WITHIN LERAY TOWNSHIP TO PROVIDE FOR THE
FUTURE ORDERLY GROWTH OF THE CITY OF EAGLE LAKE.**

WHEREAS, in 1997 Blue Earth County Planning and Zoning staff held informational meeting to gather input for the promulgation of the new Comprehensive Land Use Plan. Public input from the meetings was used to identify issues that needed to be addressed in the update of the County Comprehensive plan. Public meetings were held in Mapleton, Mankato, Lake Crystal, St. Clair, Amboy, and Madison Lake. Several issues were identified that were important to the citizens of the County. Protection of agricultural land, control of urban sprawl, and encroachment of incompatible non-farm uses into agricultural areas were some of the issues identified. Other issues included: protection of surface water and groundwater, the impact of failed and/or failing septic systems on surface and groundwater, feedlots, development of lake property and preventing erosion of shorelines, fish-kills from contamination of surface waters, weed growth in the lakes, over-application of lawn fertilizers and the resultant nutrient loading to the lakes; and,

WHEREAS, Blue Earth County Citizens, the County Board, the City of Mankato, and townships surrounding the City of Mankato have seen a need to strictly regulate residential development in the rural unincorporated areas. The Urban Fringe Overlay District (UFD) was drafted as a joint effort of the planning departments of the City of Mankato and Blue Earth County staff during the fall and winter of 1997. The UFD was adopted by the Blue Earth County Board on March 24, 1998; and,

WHEREAS, Section 24-501, Purpose of the UFD states:

(a) The purpose of this UFD urban fringe overlay district is to prevent encroachment of non-farm uses into agricultural lands, and to allow for the orderly conversion of agricultural lands to urban types which are serviced by municipal water and sewer systems. Some of the non-farm uses with the underlying districts are not compatible with, and/or may interfere with, the orderly development of this area for future urban uses if allowed to develop without the limitations imposed by this urban fringe overlay district. Limiting the intensity of development within the UFD ensures that development occurs in a fiscally and environmentally responsible manner consistent with future development plans for the area.

(b) Land use planning within the UFD should be a cooperative effort between the County and Municipality in order to work toward the most efficient, planned and cost-effective delivery of

government services. Planning within the UFD must also ensure compatibility of one community's development with the development of neighboring communities or jurisdictions.

(c) The UFD district standards allow for the continuation and maintenance of existing non-farm uses in the UFD, and,

WHEREAS, Blue Earth County supports orderly development agreements between the cities and the townships that surround them. and,

WHEREAS, Blue Earth County, LeRay Township and the City of Eagle Lake support adopting an Urban Fringe Overlay District (UFD) in the Eagle Lake area through adoption of an Official Urban Fringe Overlay District Map for the City of Eagle Lake; and,

WHEREAS, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 19-08), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and,

WHEREAS; the Planning Commission of the County on the 7th day of May, 2008, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the proposed UFD adoption, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to forward the matter to the County Board with a recommendation for approval; and,

WHEREAS; the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners held a public hearing regarding the proposed amendment on the 27th day of May, 2008. After due consideration of presented testimony and information, the Board voted to approve the UFD Map as drafted; and,

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 394.21 to 394.37 gives counties the authority to regulate land development by adopting and amending Official Land Use Controls.
2. It is the intent of the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners to work closely and cooperatively with the cities and townships to work toward the most efficient, planned, and cost-effective delivery of government services. The Board believes that planning within the UFD must also ensure compatibility of one community's development with the development of neighboring communities or jurisdictions.
3. The Eagle Lake area is experiencing rapid growth. Staff has responded to many requests from property owners who are interested in developing large lot subdivisions served by individual wells and septic systems.
4. The County's Comprehensive Plan directs residential development into the cities where municipal infrastructure is available. Provision of municipal services permits smaller lots, more compact development, and better stewardship of the land because areas do not need to be provided for primary and secondary drain field sites.
5. The adoption of a UFD map for the area will limit the residential development of Agricultural Zoned Land in the County unless municipal infrastructure is extended.
6. The proliferation of non-farm homes in the county has resulted in some conflicts between the non-farm residences and the primary purpose of the rural area, that being for agricultural uses. Adoption and implementation of the UFD Zone will help curtail future land use conflicts.
7. Adoption of a UFD map and implementation of the UFD Zone around the city will provide a future growth area for the city and will preserve the land further out for agricultural purposes.

8. Adoption of a UFD map for and around the City of Eagle Lake will include a “feedlot setback ring” which will prohibit the establishment of new feedlots within a mile of the city limits of Eagle Lake. Elimination of feedlots within this ring will provide an uncluttered area absent of conflicting uses for the city to grow into. The feedlot ring shown on the UFD map is not intended to move outward as land is annexed to the city in the future. The ring can be re-adjusted as needed in the future by amending the map.
9. The City of Eagle Lake has indicated a desire for adoption of a UFD Map establishing a feedlot setback ring and implementing the UFD Zone around the City of Eagle Lake.
10. LeRay Township has indicated a desire for adoption of a UFD Map limiting residential development of Agricultural Zoned Land around the City of Eagle Lake, implementing the UFD Zone, and establishing a feedlot setback ring within LeRay Township around the city of Eagle Lake.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the Official Eagle Lake UFD Map dated May 17, 2008 is hereby adopted.

This Map Amendment shall become effective 30 days after County Board approval and after publication.

CELLULAR COMMUNICATIONS TOWER IN THE A, AGRICULTURE ZONED DISTRICT
IN THE SW 1/4 OF SECTION 20, MC PHERSON TOWNSHIP**

WHEREAS, David and Sandra Gahl, owners of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth to wit:

the Southwest Quarter of Section 20, Township 107North Range 25 West of the 5th principal meridian, Blue Earth County, Minnesota,

are requesting a conditional use permit allowing construction and operation of a 250 foot tall Cellular Telephone Communications Tower in the SW 1/4, Section 20, McPherson Township; and,

WHEREAS, the legal description of the proposed tract to be leased by Rural Cellular Communication Corporation LLC is: described as follows:

A lease tract for telecommunication purposes over, under and across the herein before described property, described as follows:

Commencing at the northwest corner of the Southwest Quarter of Section 20, Township 107 North, Range 25 West: thence North 89 degrees 23 minutes 45 seconds East 598.52 feet, along the north line of said Southwest Quarter; thence South 00 degrees 36 minutes 15 seconds East 233.00 feet to the Point of beginning of the lease tract to be described; thence continuing South 00 degrees 36 minutes 15 seconds East 100.00 feet; thence North 89 degrees 23 minutes 45

seconds East 100.00 feet; thence North 00 degrees 36 minutes 15 seconds West 100.00 feet; thence South 89 degrees 23 minutes 45 seconds West 100.00 feet to the point of beginning.

Contains 10,000 square feet, more or less, being .23 acres, more or less; and,

WHEREAS, The access easement to the site is described as follows:

A 20.00 foot wide easement for access and utility purposes over, under and across that part of the herein before described property lying 20.00 feet to the right of the following described sideline:

Commencing at the point of beginning of the herein before described lease tract; thence North 89 degrees 23 minutes 45 seconds East 40.00 feet to the Point of Beginning of the sideline to be described; thence North 00 degrees 36 minutes 15 seconds West 200.00 feet to the Southerly right of way of 177th Street and there terminating.

It is intended that the sidelines of the herein before described access and utility easement be shortened or extended to intersect with the southerly right of way of 177th Street and the North line of the herein before described lease tract.

WHEREAS; the request to approve the Cell Tower does not conflict with the Land Use Plan; and,

WHEREAS; the Planning Commission of the County on the 7th Day of May, 2008, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to forward the matter to the County Board with a recommendation for approval subject to conditions contained in staff report No. PC 20-08, and,

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. The telecommunications tower does not conflict with the County Land Use Plan.
2. The telecommunications tower will not degrade the water quality of the County.
3. The telecommunications tower will not adversely increase the quantity of water run-off.
4. That the soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the telecommunications tower.
5. The telecommunications tower does not create a potential pollution hazard.
6. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or are being provided for operation of the telecommunications tower.
7. Adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide sufficient off-street parking and loading space to serve the telecommunications tower.
8. The telecommunications tower will not result in traffic congestion or traffic hazards.

9. The telecommunications tower will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
10. The establishment of the telecommunications tower will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for the predominant uses in the area.
11. Adequate measures will be taken to prevent or control lighted signs and other lights in such a manner that no disturbance to neighbors will result.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request for approval of the Cell Tower is hereby **granted** contingent upon the following:

1. The tower shall be set back from the roadway and property lines as per attached site plan.
2. Accessory building(s) may be allowed for each co-location user of the facility. Each building shall house only electronic equipment and environmental control equipment that is necessary for the functioning of the broadcasting/telecommunications tower. The building shall be painted and maintained as a single, neutral color.
3. The tower and accessory buildings shall be adequately fenced. Gates shall be locked.
4. The property owner shall ensure that the site is maintained in a weed free and nuisance free manner.
5. Signs, other than warning signs, equipment labels, or emergency information, are prohibited on any towers, antennae or accessory structure or equipment. Warning signs, equipment labels and emergency information signs must not exceed three square feet in area.
6. The broadcasting/telecommunications tower shall be a single, neutral color, unless alternative colors are required by the FAA.
7. The broadcasting/telecommunications tower shall meet all requirements of the FAA and FCC.
8. The parking surface and access drives shall be maintained with an all weather surface.
9. A bond or other financial assurance acceptable to Blue Earth County shall be established and kept in place to ensure proper removal of all concrete foundations and fittings in the event that the Tower is abandoned. Abandoned or unused towers and associated facilities shall be removed within twelve months of the cessation of operations at the site.
10. The broadcasting/telecommunications tower shall be designed, structurally, electrically and in all respects, to accommodate the applicant's antenna and comparable antennae from at least three additional users. The tower must be designed to allow for future rearrangement of antennae upon the tower and to accept antennae mounted at varying heights.

11. Any change in operation or use of the facility shall require review of the Conditional Use Permit. The applicant shall apply for a review of the Conditional Use Permit prior to any operational or construction changes involved with the proposed use.
12. Violations of any of the above conditions may lead to a review of the Conditional Use Permit by the Planning Commission and County Board of Commissioners.
13. Applicant agrees to grant the County a first refusal right to use antennae space on the tower and equipment space within the accessory building(s). Such space to be for governmental use including, but not limited to; communications service antennae and related equipment to accommodate Cellular Telephone Service, Personal Communication Services (PCS), and Cellular Digital Packet Data (CPDA) Service, to the extent the tower can accommodate such use. If space is not available within the accessory building, the owner of the tower shall allow the County to construct additional accessory building(s) as required to house County equipment. Owner of the tower shall make the space available at the prevailing market rate.

If the County reserves space for governmental use, the County will ensure that any equipment installed by the County on the tower, or in the accessory building, will not interfere with the operation of the applicants or other tenants equipment. Correction of any interference caused by installation of County equipment shall be the County's responsibility. Interference caused by any other tenant's equipment installed after the County's equipment, shall be the responsibility of the third party.

All utility costs, and costs connected with installation and maintenance of County equipment shall be borne by the County.

The County will provide appropriate proof of insurance and / or release of liability to the tower owner. Such insurance / release of liability shall apply equally to equipment owned or controlled by the County and / or actions taken by County employees and / or agent(s).

14. The Conditional Use Permit shall be effective for a period of five years following County Board approval, until May 27, 2013, whereupon it may be reviewed by the Board.

This conditional use permit shall become effective immediately upon its passage and without publication.

RE-ZONING AN APPROXIMATELY 7.1 ACRE PARCEL FROM CONSERVATION ZONED
DISTRICT TO AGRICULTURE ZONED DISTRICT IN THE NE 1/4
OF THE SW 1/4 OF SECTION 23, JUDSON TOWNSHIP.**

WHEREAS, Pamela J. Harbo, owner of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth to wit:

That part of the North one half of the Southwest Quarter (N1/2 of SW 1/4) except that part platted as Country Oaks Subdivision lying South and East of the Chicago, St. Paul, Minneapolis, and Omaha Railroad Company in Section twenty-three (23), Township One Hundred Eight (108), Range twenty-eight (28), Blue Earth County, Minnesota,

is requesting approval of a Map Amendment re-zoning the above referenced land from C-Conservation to A-Agriculture; and,

WHEREAS, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 21-08), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and,

WHEREAS; the re-zone request does not conflict with the Land Use Plan; and,

WHEREAS; the Planning Commission of the County on the 7th Day of May, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to forward the matter to the County Board with a recommendation for approval subject to conditions contained in staff report No. PC 21-08, and,

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. The proposed map amendment does not conflict with the land use plan.
2. Re-zoning this parcel from Conservation to Agricultural will not be a spot-zone or a change in County Policy. Contiguous land to the east is already zoned Agricultural. Apple Orchards are a permitted agricultural use in the Conservation and Agricultural Zoned Districts.
3. Re-zoning the property from Conservation to Agriculture will allow a conditional use permit to be granted for a farm winery.
4. The proposed Map Amendment will not change the appearance or use of Welsh Heritage Farms or neighboring properties.
5. The Map Amendment should not significantly increase the amount of nutrient laden storm-water runoff into the wetlands in front of the facility.
6. This property has been used for agricultural purposes for at least the last 27 years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request to amend the Official Map of Blue Earth County by re-zoning the above referenced land is hereby **granted** contingent upon the following:

1. 30 days have elapsed after the Map Amendment has been approved by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners and published in the official newspaper of the County.

This Map Amendment shall become effective 30 days after its passage and publication.
