PLANNING AND ZONING

Mr. Veryl Morrell, Land Use Administrator, and Ms. Sara Isebrand, Land Use Specialist, presented the following items to the Board.

Commissioner Purvis moved and Commissioner McLaughlin seconded the motion to approve the following resolution:

RESOLUTION GRANTING AN EXTENSION OF PC 12-03, A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT TO MINE GRAVEL, STORE, CRUSH AND BLEND RECYCLED BITUMINOUS AND CONCRETE MATERIAL, AND TO PLACE AN OCCASIONAL BITUMINOUS HOT MIX PLANT AND/OR CONCRETE BATCHING PLANT IN THE SE 1/4 OF THE NE 1/4, SECTION 21, CAMBRIA TOWNSHIP IN AN AGRICULTURAL ZONED DISTRICT.

Whereas, Winton Jones, owner of the gravel pit and MR Paving and Excavating, operators of the gravel mining operation in the County of Blue Earth to wit:

The Southeast 1/4 of the Northeast 1/4 in Section 21, Township109, Range 29, Blue Earth County, Minnesota.

Is requesting continuation of a Conditional Use Permit granted by Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners for a gravel mining operation, to operate a bituminous hot mix plant and/or concrete batching plant, and to store and crush recycled bituminous and concrete materials; and,

Whereas, the existing gravel mining operation does not conflict with the Land Use Plan, Gravel Mining Operations are a Conditional Use in the Agricultural Zoned District. Storage, crushing and blending of recycled bituminous and concrete materials and placement of hot mix plants and concrete batching plants are accessory uses to gravel mining operations; and,

Whereas, the Planning Commission of the County completed a review of the application and made a report to said request (PC 39-08), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and,

Whereas, the requested use does not conflict with the Land Use Plan. Gravel Mining Operations are a Conditional Use in the Agricultural Zoned District; and,

Whereas, the blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. That the proposed use conforms with the Land Use Plan.
2. That with proper management, the proposed use will not degrade the water quality of the County.
3. That with proper management, the proposed use will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
4. That soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the proposed use.
5. That the proposed use does not create a potential pollution hazard.
6. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or are being proposed.
7. That the Conditional Use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
8. That the establishment of the Conditional Use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for the predominant uses in the area.
9. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to prevent or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise, and vibration, so that none of these will constitute a nuisance, and to control lighted signs and other lights in such a manner that no disturbance to neighboring properties will result.
10. The intensity of the proposed use is not greater than the intensity of the surrounding land uses.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request for a Conditional Use Permit is hereby granted based on the following conditions:

1. The gravel mining and hot mix plant operations shall be conducted in compliance with the laws of the State of Minnesota, the Federal Government, and the Blue Earth County Zoning Ordinance, Section 24.
2. The applicant shall obtain and maintain all air emissions and water quality permits as required by MPCA.
3. Hours of operation shall be limited to 7:00 AM through 9:00 PM to prevent disturbance noise during normal sleeping hours, except for a one hour “quiet warmup period” for hot mix plant operations beginning at 6:00 AM.
4. Access points from and onto any road or highway shall be clearly indicated, and only those access points shall be utilized. All access points must be approved by the appropriate jurisdictional agency.
5. Trucks used in hauling materials from the site of excavation shall be loaded in such a manner as to minimize spillage onto public roadways. Precautions must be taken to minimize the deposit of dirt and mined materials onto public roads or highways. Any spillage resulting from overloading or from adhering to truck tires shall be removed at regular intervals.
6. The amount of overburden to be removed shall not be in excess of that required to undertake operations in an economical manner. Development toward the final reclamation plan shall be carried on as excavation progresses.
7. Proposed back slopes, graded or back filled areas, or banks shall conform to the approved reclamation plan and shall be covered with sufficient topsoil to provide for re-vegetation. Where ground cover or other planting is indicated on an approved plan, such planting shall be made in areas where excavation is completed and land is not being used for material storage, and shall be as recommended by the SWCD.
8. Upon completion of excavation, all buildings, plants, and equipment, shall be removed within six (6) months, unless such buildings, plants, and equipment will be used in the reclamation process.
9. Operating procedures will be utilized to control dust and noise so as not to be in conflict with adjoining property owners.
10. Mining operations shall not be conducted closer than fifty (50) feet to the boundary of an adjoining property line, unless the written consent of the adjoining property owner is first secured.
11. Excavating or stockpiling shall not be conducted closer than one hundred (100) feet to the right-of-way line of any existing or platted street, road, or highway, where such excavation may create a traffic or line of site problem.

12. An annuity policy has been presented to the County in the amount of \$10,000 earning a fixed rate of interest, to guarantee that either upon termination of the permit or the operations, the ground surface of the land used shall be restored in conformity with the reclamation plan filed with the mining permit application.
13. The applicant shall obtain a Department of Natural Resources water appropriation permit if the applicant will be pumping more than 10,000 gallons per day or 1 million gallons per year to either dewater and/or to wash the aggregate.
14. This permit shall be effective for a period of five years and will expire on October 21, 2013, after which it will be reviewed by the Blue Earth County Board.
15. The applicant shall go before the Cambria Township board at their October 14th meeting to inform the township of their intentions of mining this pit for the next 5 years.

This Conditional Use Permit shall become effective immediately upon it's passage and without publication.
