November 15, 2005

AMENDED AGENDA

Commissioner Landkamer moved and Commissioner Bruender seconded the motion to approve the amended agenda with the removal of the Brown County Evaluation contract. The motion carried. 2005-448

COMMITTEE REPORTS

The Commissioners reported on the committees they attended since the last Board Meeting.

ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

Mr. Dennis McCoy, County Administrator, presented the following items to the Board.

Commissioner Landkamer moved and Commissioner Bruender seconded the motion to approve the following resolution regarding a JOBZ boundary modification:

**RESOLUTION OF APPROVAL TO AUTHORIZE
JOB OPPORTUNITY BUILDING ZONE (JOBZ) TAX EXEMPTIONS**

WHEREAS, job creation, business development, and individual wealth growth in Blue Earth County (the "County") have been less than the national and state averages; and

WHEREAS, the resulting affects of such lagging job creation, business development, and individual wealth growth have harmed and are forecasted to continue to harm the economy of the County; and

WHEREAS, the Job Opportunity Building Zone (the "JOBZ") Program created in Minnesota Session Laws 2003, 1st Special Session, Chapter 21, Article 1 allows for the formation of tax free zones; and

WHEREAS, an application for tax free zone designation that includes properties in the County was approved by the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development; and

WHEREAS, the County finds it is necessary to modify the "City of Mankato JOBZ Subzones Application" previously submitted to the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development via the Region 9 Development Commission;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of Blue Earth County, Minnesota, as follows:

Sec. 1. That the County Board of Commissioners, at its meeting held on November 15, 2005, upon careful consideration and review, approves the request to modify the City of Mankato JOBZ Subzones Application as per amended application materials dated November 8, 2005 (MJ Biologics, Inc. project) for tax free zones, approves of the use of tax exemptions and tax credits within the designated Subzone (subject to proper review and approval by the other appropriate taxing authorities within the Subzone), and encourages the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development to approve the request to modify the City of Mankato JOBZ Subzones Application, as referenced herein.

Sec. 2. That the County agrees to provide all of the local tax exemptions and credits required and provided for under the JOBZ's Legislation and agrees to forego the tax benefits resulting from the local and state tax exemptions and credits provided under the JOBZ's Legislation.

WHEREAS, Pat Germo (1/5 Etal) and Clarice Germo, owners of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth to wit:

The Northwest Quarter of Section 28, Township 106 North, Range 25 West, Blue Earth County, Minnesota.

are requesting that the development right be transferred from a piece of open farmland to an adjacent piece of farmland adjacent to 613th Avenue to permit construction of a second residence in that particular quarter-quarter section;

WHEREAS, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 39-05), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and,

WHEREAS; the request to transfer development rights does not conflict with the Land Use Plan, up to four homes are permitted in any individual 1/4-1/4 section in the Agricultural Zoned District through approval of a Conditional Use Permit authorizing transfer of developments by the Blue Earth County board of Commissioners; and,

RESOLUTION GRANTING A MAP AMENDMENT TO AMEND THE OFFICIAL LAND USE MAP OF BLUE EARTH COUNTY BY RE-ZONING A PORTION OF THE NE 1/4 OF SECTION 10, VERNON CENTER TOWNSHIP FROM LI, LIGHT INDUSTRIAL ZONING TO AN A, AGRICULTURE ZONE

WHEREAS, Ron Bergemann and Doug Bergemann, owners of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, to wit:

The Northeast Quarter of Section 10, Township 106 North, Range 28 West, Blue Earth County, Minnesota.

have requested a Map Amendment to amend the official Land Use Map of Blue Earth County by re-zoning approximately 55 acres of the NE 1/4 of Section 10, Vernon Center Township from LI light industrial zoning to an A, agricultural zone; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (42-05), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the County on the 2nd day of November, 2005, following proper notice, held a public hearing regarding the request and, following the hearing, adopted a recommendation that the request for a Map Amendment be granted; and

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds that:

1. The proposed Map Amendment will serve to enable the existing land use to be brought into compliance with the Blue Earth County Land Use Plan.
2. The proposed map Amendment will not affect the residential density of the area.
3. The Map Amendment will not have a detrimental effect on neighboring properties, nor will it interfere with the ability of neighboring property owners to develop their properties for permitted uses in the neighboring zoning districts.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request for a Map Amendment to amend the official Land Use Map of Blue Earth County by re-zoning approximately 55 acres of the NE 1/4 of Section 10, Vernon Center Township from LI light industrial zoning to an A, agricultural zone, is granted with the following conditions:

1. The re-zone will not be effective until 30 days have elapsed after the Map Amendment has been approved by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners; and the Map Amendment approval has been published.

RESOLUTION GRANTING A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT TWO TOTAL CONFINEMENT SWINE BARNs EXPANDING AN EXISTING FEEDLOT FROM 50 ANIMAL UNITS TO 530 ANIMAL UNITS LOCATED IN THE NORTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 10, VERNON CENTER TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, Ron Bergemann and Doug Bergemann, owners of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, to wit:

The Northeast Quarter of Section 10, Township 106 North, Range 28 West, Blue Earth County, Minnesota.

have applied for a Conditional Use Permit to construct two finishing barns at an existing feedlot operation with 50 animal units. The proposed expansion would allow for up to 1300 grow/finish pigs and 200 nursery pigs or 530 animal units. The dimensions of the proposed barns are 41 feet x 120 feet and will be located in the A, agricultural zoned district; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC41-05), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the County on the 2nd day of November, 2005, following proper notice, held a public hearing regarding the request and, following the hearing, adopted a recommendation that the request for a Conditional Use Permit be granted; and

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds that:

1. That with proper management of the proposed barns and with proper manure application, the Conditional Use should not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity designated for agricultural uses.
2. That with proper management of the proposed barns and with proper manure application, this facility should not constitute a pollution problem.

3. That the predominant use in the area is agriculture. The Conditional Use should not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for agricultural uses.
4. Adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or will be provided.
5. Adequate measures will be taken to provide sufficient off-road parking and loading space to serve the proposed use.
6. Soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the proposed request.
7. Proper facilities will be provided which will eliminate any traffic congestion or traffic hazard which may result from the proposed use.
8. The feedlot is not greater than the feedlot standards allowed in the A, Agricultural Zoning District.
9. The proposed use is consistent with the County Land Use Plan.
10. That the proposed use does not include residential development.
11. That the proposed use does not include industrial development.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request for a Conditional Use Permit, to expand an existing feedlot by building two total confinement swine barns in an Agriculture Zoning District, is granted with the following conditions:

1. That the total confinement barns conform with the site plan attached to this report (PC 41-05).
2. That the feedlot, including all buildings, be located on a single, legally described parcel consisting of a minimum of ten contiguous acres. The parcel shall be a parcel of record, properly recorded in the Blue Earth County Land Records Office.
3. That the applicant must obtain an updated Blue Earth County Feedlot Permit before any animals are placed in the barns.
4. That the applicant obtain a Blue Earth County Construction Permit before building begins and within one year from the date the County Board of Commissioners approves the Conditional Use Permit. The permit shall be rendered invalid if application for a Construction Permit is not made within this one year period. Time extensions for

Conditional Use Permits must be obtained from the County Board of Commissioners subsequent to a public hearing conducted by the Planning Commission.

5. That a perimeter footing drain tile be located at or below the bottom of the pit footings. The footing tile shall include one inspection pipe for each concrete pit. The native materials must be excavated and walls back filled with granular material (pit run gravel or equivalent). *Exceptions to this may only include specific design standards submitted by the design engineer of the manure storage structure.*
6. That management of the manure produced from the site be in accordance with the manure management plan submitted to the MPCA. Any changes in manure management from the site shall be reflected in the manure management plan on file at the feedlot. This plan must be reviewed by the operator each year and adjusted for any changes in the amount of manure production, manure nutrient test results, fields available for receiving manure, crop rotations, or other practices which affect the available nutrient amounts or crop nutrient needs on fields receiving manure as required by the MPCA. Manure application setback standards for the fields on which the manure is applied shall be followed as provided in attachment A3.
7. That the disposal of dead animals be consistent with the Minnesota Board of Animal Health regulations.
8. If rendering is the method of choice for mortality disposal, the applicant shall provide an enclosed location for the pick up of dead animals before any animals are placed in the proposed barn.
9. That adequate measures be taken to minimize or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise, or vibrations so that none of these will constitute a nuisance.
10. That the proposed manure storage structures be designed by a registered engineer. A copy of the designed plans must be submitted to Blue Earth County Environmental Services prior to the issuance of a construction permit.
11. That the applicant will furnish a final construction report to Environmental Services verifying that the concrete manure storage structures were constructed per approved engineered design plans. Said construction report shall be signed by a professional engineer registered in the State of Minnesota and will include the following:
photographic documentation of reinforcing steel placement, collection of three sample concrete cylinders to be retained by the engineer / landowner for concrete compressive strength testing, and three batch tickets documenting the concrete design.

12. That the applicant comply with the storm-water control requirements established by the MPCA.
13. That if a shower, restroom or laundry facility is included with the proposed addition or any other livestock barns on the site, that a waste water treatment system is reviewed and constructed according to County Environmental Health Department standards.

This resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage and without publication.

9. If properly done the Conditional Use should not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.

11. That site specific and such other conditions are established to protect the public's health, safety and general welfare.

1. The applicant shall obtain a compliance inspection on the existing septic system and furnish the results to the Environmental Health Department.
2. A staggered double row of shrubbery shall be planted and maintained at 8' spacing from the list furnished by the Minnesota DNR.

This Conditional Use Permit shall become effective immediately upon its passage and without publication.

WHEREAS; the request to transfer development rights from one quarter-quarter section to another does not conflict with the Land Use Plan. Up to four homes per quarter-quarter section are permitted via transfers of development rights by way of a conditional use permit approved by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners; and,

WHEREAS; the Planning Commission of the County on the 2nd Day of November, 2005, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to forward the matter to the County Board with a recommendation for approval subject to conditions contained in staff report No. PC 46-05, and,

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. That the proposed use conforms with the County Land Use Plan.
2. That the proposed use will not degrade the water quality of the County.
3. That the proposed use will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
4. That soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the proposed use.
5. That the proposed use does not create a potential pollution hazard.

6. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or are being provided.
7. That the Conditional Use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
8. That the establishment of the Conditional Use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for predominant uses in the area.
9. That the density of proposed residential development is not greater than the density of the surrounding neighborhood or the density indicated by the applicable Zoning District.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request to transfer development rights is hereby **granted** contingent upon the following:

1. That the land be subdivided pursuant to the Blue Earth County Subdivision Ordinance.

Through the adoption of this subsection, the board of commissioners is expressing its intent to enhance and encourage agricultural operations within the boundaries of the county. The county will view the agriculture district as a zone in which land is used for commercial agricultural production. Owners of property, residents, other users of property in the agriculture zone, and neighboring properties adjacent to the agriculture zone may be subjected to inconvenience or discomfort arising from normal and accepted agricultural practices and operations including,

but not limited to; noise, odors, dust, operation of aircraft and late night operation of farm machinery, the storage and application of manure, fertilizers, soil amendments, herbicides and pesticides associated with normal agricultural operations. Owners of property, residents, other users of property in the agriculture zone, and neighboring properties adjacent to the agriculture zone, should be prepared to accept such inconveniences or discomfort from normal operations, and are hereby put on official notice, pursuant to Minn. Stats. ch. 561.19, that this declaration may prevent them from obtaining a legal judgment against such normal operations.

2. All required infrastructure (monumentation) must be installed prior to recordation of the Final Plat.
3. The Final Plat must be recorded within one year of approval by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners.
4. Compliance inspections must be performed on the septic systems servicing the two homes prior to the sale of same. Copies of the compliance inspection reports shall be furnished to prospective purchasers and the Environmental Health Department.
5. Construction and septic permits must be obtained prior to commencement of construction on lots within the subdivision.

This Final Plat approval shall become effective immediately upon its passage and without publication.

3. The repair benefits for the additional land described as 27.2 acres in the Northeast Quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of the Southeast Quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 6 of Garden City Township (T107N, R28W), Blue Earth County, MN, is set at \$641.10 and the Southeast Quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Northeast Quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 6 of Garden City Township (T107N, R28W), is set at \$63.64
4. The CD 87 repair benefits in the Northeast Quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of the Southeast Quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Garden City Township (T107N, R28W), Blue Earth County, MN, be reduced by \$672.00 for the 27.2 acres being removed from the watershed and the CD 87 repair benefits in the Southeast Quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Northeast Quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 6 of Garden City Township (T107N, R28W), Blue Earth County, MN, be reduced by \$50.00 for the 2.7 acres being removed from the watershed.

An agreement with M:Space to provide telehealth equipment, installation, and maintenance as requested by the South Central Community-Based Initiative.

Hearth Connections

An addendum to the agreement with Hearth Connections to administer additional rental assistance funding received from the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency.

Department of Human Services - Child & Teen Checkup

A grant agreement with the Minnesota Department of Human Services to provide Child & Teen Checkup administrative services to families with children under the age of 21. The grant agreement provides \$104,175.00 annually and covers the period from January 1, 2006, through December 31, 2007.

Department of Human Services - Mental Health Grant Application

This application covers funding associated with community support programs, crisis services, case management, housing services, and South Central Community-Based Initiative programming. The grant application pertains to funding for calendar years 2006 and 2007.
